Parish Registration

Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

Reflections for the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Today's Gospel reports two stories of healing. Jairus, a man of considerable standing in the Jewish community.

Distraught over his daughter's poor health, he approaches Jesus and asks him to heal her. As Jesus leaves with Jairus, there is a second person who seeks healing from Jesus, a woman with a hemorrhage. This woman secretly touches Jesus from behind and is immediately cured. In response, Jesus turns and asks who touched him. The crowds are pushing in on Jesus, and yet he, knowing that power has gone out of him, asks who touched him. The woman could have remained anonymous, yet at Jesus' question she steps forward and acknowledges what she has done. Jesus responds by acknowledging her as a model of faith and sends her away in peace.

Jairus's becomes impatient with Jesus; his daughter is dying and Jesus hasn't helped him yet. Messengers suddenly arrive and confirm Jairus's worst fear: his daughter has died. Jesus curiously ignores their message and reassures Jairus. When they arrive at Jairus's home, they find family and friends mourning the girl's death. Jesus enters the room of the dead girl, takes her by the hand, and instructs her to arise. Jairus's faith in Jesus has not been in vain; his daughter is restored to life.

The Gospel concludes with Jesus' instructions to remain silent about this miracle. Repeatedly, those who witness Jesus' power and authority are instructed to not speak of what they have witnessed. These instructions appear impossible to obey, but in each case, they seem to emphasize the fact each individual must make his or her own act of faith in affirming Jesus as God's Son.

My Dear Parishioners,

I am amazed at how time flies. Five years have passed since I first walked through the doors of Visitation. Such a gift came because the Lord chose to bless me with a parish community that reflected the Gospel truth of the Father's love and mercy for the world. I could see from the start that the people here were strong in their faith and in their desire to serve God and one another.

As I look back at those years, I have many fond memories of my time spent here. Together (under my guidance and with your support) the parish (physically and spiritually) has grown. With the financial support of the parish members and organizations such as the Rosary Altar Society and Holy Name Society, much has been done to improve the aging facilities. The sacredness of the worship space was enhanced in a number of ways including: worn carpet in the sanctuary was replaced with wood, the lighting was upgraded to help us focus on light instead of darkness and the altar and processional candles were replaced. Handicapped doors were installed by the elevator entrance and a handicapped, family restroom was constructed and the rest rooms were upgraded on the main floor of the church. Roofs were repaired on the church, old church, and rectory buildings. The chimney was repaired. An energy efficient boiler for the church building and air conditioning units for the basement of the church were installed. New tile in the basement of the rectory, curtains in the daily chapel to preserve the sacred space when room was used for activities, and the list goes on. Much more is to be done.

Together we weathered the changes in the Mass. Superstorm Sandy brought many challenges to our community and our parish. Although full recovery is still in the future, I am proud of the accomplishments of the Visitation Relief Center in providing support and resources to so many people.

It is with a heavy heart that I leave you, but as we all know change is inevitable. Your mercy to me began with your welcome and will continue with your prayers as I transition to the next journey in my life.

Finally, I want to thank all of you for your love, prayers, and support. May the Lord bless you abundantly for responding to his grace and embracing me with such love. Please know that I am grateful beyond words that you have shown me what it means to exercise my priesthood for others.
