Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. 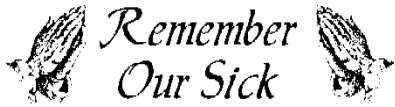

Reflections for the Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Last Sunday we heard Jesus lament the particular challenges those with many possessions face in order to enter the Kingdom of God. Jesus then predicts his passion to the Twelve, who are amazed and afraid.

In today's Gospel, James and John ask to be given seats of honor when Jesus enters into his glory. Once again, the disciples seem to be selective in what they hear Jesus say. They want to share Jesus' glory, but do not appear to understand that his glory will be preceded by his suffering. Jesus notes their lack of understanding and predicts the suffering they will endure for the sake of the Gospel. Jesus says that the honor they seek is not his to give. When the other ten hear what James and John have asked, Mark reports that they are indignant. Jesus takes the opportunity to teach them.

Jesus explains the importance of service and sacrifice in the life of a disciple. In particular, he seems to be preparing the Twelve for their leadership roles in the emerging Christian community. Echoing the Gospel we heard several weeks ago (on the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Mark 9:33-37), Jesus acknowledges that his teaching is countercultural. In today's Gospel, Jesus contrasts the dynamics within the community of disciples with those shown by the rulers of the Gentiles.

Following Jesus' example of sacrificial love continues to be countercultural in our day as well. We might take this opportunity to consider our models of authority and examine our own exercise of authority. On whose example do we model our leadership? *Loyola Press*

Given the discussion reported from the current Synod of Bishops on the Family, this may be a good opportunity to review the Church’s teachings on marriage so that we can properly respond to speculation as well as clarify our own expectations from the Synod. Simply put, the Church’s understanding of marriage comes from Jesus Himself: Jesus said to them, “Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery.” (Mark 10:11-12) Try as we might to rationalize what he really meant, it is difficult to deny that Jesus was against someone divorcing and marrying another. The Catholic Church has always been quite specific about the indissolubility of marriage: it cannot be ended except through the death of one of the partners: “The marriage covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of their whole life; the essential properties of marriage are unity and indissolubility; in Christian marriage they acquire a distinctive firmness by reason of the sacrament” (*Code of Canon Law*, 1055-1056). Divorce and remarriage is considered intrinsically disordered, both of the divorced person and of the person who knowingly attempts marriage to a divorced person.

A persistent error is that divorced and re-married persons are excommunicated from the Church. This is simply not true. Individuals in this situation are encouraged (and obligated as Catholics) to participate in the sacramental life of the Church to the greatest extent possible. They should not receive the Eucharist, as this implies an informed consent to the way of life which Jesus taught, one that they have publicly contradicted. Incidentally, this restriction also applies to cohabiting couples, as they in violation of the first property of marriage mentioned above, namely that of unity.

Does this mean that people who have divorced and remarried are forever excluded from receiving Communion? Not necessarily. Although the Church remains insists on the permanence of marriage, she does her best to determine as far as possible if prior marriage(s) were truly sacramental in the first place. Canon law also states that those who are “impeded” (i.e. have some condition or situation which prevents a true contract) from marriage do not validly enter a marriage. Several factors could contribute (Canons 1073-1107 give examples: lacking sufficient use of reason, unable to assume the duties of marriage due to physiological/psychological reason, ignorance of the permanence of marriage, etc.) Most of the work of diocesan tribunals (i.e. Church courts) in the United States involves annulment investigation. If through such investigation it is discovered that some impediment prohibited the sacramentally valid contract of marriage in the first place, then the marriage is considered null and the persons are free to marry in the Catholic Church. Streamlining this process while still attempting to remain true to Church doctrine was the subject of Pope Francis’ *motu proprio* (Latin for “on his own initiative) issued back in September (details at www.news.va/en/news/motu-proprio-mitis-iudex-dominus-iesus-and-mitis-e).

If you are in such a situation, either as a divorced person who has remarried or one who has married someone who has been divorced, consider contacting us to apply for an annulment investigation. If the prior marriage(s) are determined to be invalid, then your marriage can be convalidated (“blessed”) by the Church.

RCIA CORNER

WHY DO WE NOT RE-BAPTIZE THOSE THAT WERE BAPTIZED IN ANOTHER FAITH?

Cannon 845.1 states that the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders cannot be repeated. They imprint a character on the recipient that cannot be taken away. Only an unbaptized person can be baptized. So what happens when someone comes from another faith who wants to be a Catholic?

Those who have been validly baptized outside the Catholic Church become Catholics by making a profession of the Catholic faith and being formally received into the Church. This is normally followed immediately by Confirmation and the Eucharist.

There is only one baptism for all and as long as the proper form is followed there is no need to re-baptize. There are three criteria for Baptism. One, the intent must be there to Baptize; second, water must be poured or the recipient must be immersed in the water and finally they must be baptized in the name of the Trinity. If all of these conditions are met the person is considered baptized.

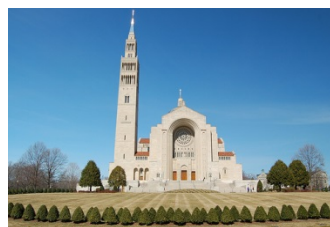

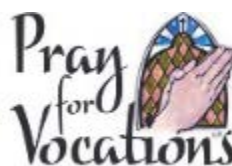

The Diocese of Trenton reports any allegations of sexual abuse to the appropriate law enforcement agencies. Anyone with an allegation is also encouraged to provide that information to local law enforcement authorities.

COMMUNION FOR THE HOMEBOUND



When a loved one cannot attend mass due to illness, it is often a desire to bring Communion to them. However the Universal Church has regulations to ensure that

proper respect is shown for the Blessed Sacrament at all times. The Universal Church allows for lay people who have been **properly trained** to distribute Communion, including to the homebound. This training includes theological and spiritual aspects as well as practical aspects surrounding the distribution of Holy Communion. It is important that proper respect and adherence to Universal Church teaching is maintained at all times. When the Blessed Sacrament is administered outside of Mass, it must be transported in an appropriate vessel. If the person is unable to attend Mass for a period of time, please call the Rectory Office at 732-477-7059 ext. 216 during office hours so that we can schedule a Eucharistic Minister to visit the home.
