Parish Registration

The Church of the Visitation is obliged to serve and minister to all baptized Catholics living in our local area. **PLEASE REGISTER** – it assists the staff in knowing you as a parishioner, providing for your needs, informing you of parish programs and activities, and utilizing your gifts and talents in service of the Church and one another. Envelopes for weekly contributions are available to you once you are registered. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to register.

Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Anointing of the Sick

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

Penance/Reconciliation

Saturday from 3:15 to 3:45PM in the Church or anytime by appointment. A Penance Service is held during Advent and Lent.

Religious Education (CCD)

Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King



In today's reading, we hear one of two dialogues between Jesus and Pilate that are reported in John's Gospel. Pilate questions Jesus about the charges brought against him. Caiaphas and the high priests have charged Jesus with a political crime, one that would require a punishment of death. Pilate distances himself from the Jewish leaders who accuse Jesus; he is not a Jew, and he seems to want little to do with this Jewish affair.

In his responses to Pilate's questions, Jesus distinguishes his kingdom from the political powers of this world. King and kingdom may be appropriate terms for Jesus' mission and promise, but only by analogy. Jesus is king, but not the kind of king we imagine or expect. He was certainly not the kind of king Pilate feared he might be.

Jesus refers to a kingdom that does not belong to this world. This has been mentioned earlier in John's Gospel. Recall that in his prayer during the Last Supper discourse (see John 17:6-18), Jesus prayed for his disciples who are in the world but do not belong to the world. Yet like Jesus, they are sent into the world for the world's salvation. In today's reading, we see Jesus identify the final proof that his kingdom is not of this world: If his kingdom were of this world, then there would be people fighting to save him.

Truth has been another important theme in John's Gospel. We see it emphasized in the conclusion of the dialogue between Jesus and Pilate. Those who know the truth will recognize Jesus as king and will know how to interpret this insight. Yet Jesus' kingship was hidden from many of his contemporaries. Only those chosen, those who have the eyes of faith, are able to see. As modern disciples of Jesus, we also struggle at times to recognize Jesus as king. Today's Gospel invites us to see with eyes of faith that we might recognize that Jesus, through his crucifixion and death, is indeed king and Savior of all. *Loyola Press*

As we prepare for Thanksgiving and the season of Advent, I'd like to offer some reflection on the many who are instead devoting great energy to the holiday shopping season: many of whom never did or no longer bother going to church on Sunday.

Recently, research on the subject conducted by the evangelical Christian polling firm the Barna Group was published in Churchless: Understanding Today's Unchurched and How to Connect with Them (available at <http://www.amazon.com/Churchless-Understanding-Todays-Unchurched-Connect/dp/1414387091>).

They concluded that most reasons for people leaving or becoming less active were not so much theological as practical: churches seem restrictive and overprotective, Christianity as practiced is too shallow, antagonistic to science or judgmental and rigid about sexuality; the perceived exclusivity of Christianity is a turnoff; churches are unfriendly to those who doubt or don't share their beliefs.

A look at this list and the common response to entrench ourselves shows the urgent need of Catholics to remember exactly who we are: the ancient word catholic comes from the Greek katholikos and means "universal". As God is universal, the very reason of our Church is – not a place for great music, innovative programs or even fantastic preaching – but a place to meet God. As important and helpful as these things are, they mean nothing if the gratitude and desire to share the Good News to those around us – Catholic and otherwise – isn't found at the heart of our church, our worship, even our daily lives. As our societal values continue to decay and the inevitable outbreaks of violence that flow from this occur, now at a rate that many rarely even get much attention anymore, it becomes all the more imperative that we re-assert the values that not only made our nation great but also draw us back to Christ.

As we prepare to enter into the mystery of the Incarnation, the Word who became flesh and dwelt among us, take a moment to reflect on how our lives may show (or fail to show) the imprint of this belief to others and how we can resolve to change. This way, we can make this an Advent and Christmas season worthy of our calling as Catholics, reflecting a true thanksgiving and giving of ourselves for all that God has done for us.

A blessed Thanksgiving to all of you!
