Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Reflections for the Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week's Gospel speaks of how Jesus' disciples are to conduct themselves as they await the Kingdom of Heaven. In preceding passages Jesus taught that there is no way to predict the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven. His disciples must, therefore, remain vigilant and ready to receive the Son of Man at any time.

Before he leaves on a journey, the master entrusts to his servants a different number of talents, giving to each according to their abilities. A talent is a coin of great value. Upon the master's return, he finds that the first and second servants have doubled their money, and both are rewarded. The third servant, however, has only preserved what was given to him because he was afraid to lose the money. He has risked nothing; he did not even deposit the money in a bank to earn interest. This servant is punished by the master, and his talent is given to the one who brought the greatest return.

This parable teaches that God's judgment will be based on the service we render to God and to one another in accordance with the gifts that God has given to us. Our gifts, or talents, are given to us for the service of others. If we fail to use these gifts, God's judgment on us will be severe. On the other hand, if we make use of these gifts in service to the Kingdom of Heaven, we will be rewarded and entrusted with even more responsibilities.

Our life of prayer helps us to discern the gifts that have been given to us by God. This prayer and discernment ought to lead us to use our gifts in the service of God and our neighbor. God's grace allows us to share in the work of serving the Kingdom of Heaven.. *Loyola Press*

THANKSGIVING DAY MASSES

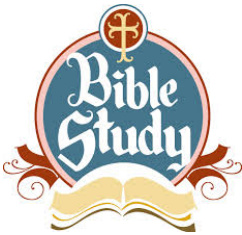

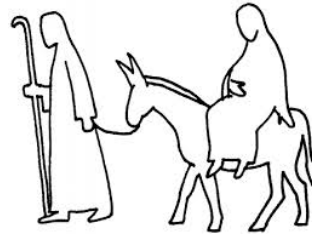

RESPECT LIFE



The Euthanasia Movement is becoming more active in our country and recently two more states have legalized assisted suicide making the total of five states now! Assemblyman John Burzichelli (D-Gloucester) has been leading the fight, claiming that the basic

issue is "freedom of choice and control of ones body."

Even the Medical Society of New Jersey and some disabled-rights groups argue that provisions are inadequate to protect the vulnerable against coercion or misdiagnosis.

We are staying on top this and will put out an alert or phone calls as soon as there is new movement by Burzichelli who withdrew the measure in June since he did not have the 41 votes needed to pass it.

THE SYNOD ON THE FAMILY

The Bishop's concluded the most recent Synod on the Family by saying:

“We must give hope to those families in difficult situations, while at the same time promoting the riches and beauty that family life embodies. Among the challenges listed in the message are those of marital breakdown, of sickness or bereavement, of poverty and unemployment, conflict, persecution and exploitation of women and children. The bishops call on governments and international organizations to promote the rights of the family, but they also insist that the credibility of the Church lies in its ability to be a house with open doors to welcome all people in every situation....

Cardinal Gracias, who heads the Federation of Asian Bishops Conferences, said in his region where Christians are a tiny minority, traditionally strong family values are also under threat. This message, he said, admits the Church does not have answers to all the questions people are posing today. But the bishops do firmly reiterate a commitment to finding pastoral approaches for all people in their care, based on the teachings of Scripture and tradition.

“There are the Catholic principles, Scripture, Magisterium, but also openness, a pastoral approach for everyone.....you ask if gays are welcome? The answer is an unequivocal ‘Yes’.”

Despite the heated debate that has characterized the past two weeks ‘work, most bishops are encouraged by the atmosphere of honesty that Pope Francis called for at the start of the Synod.”

This is a very hopeful statement that comes from our Bishops. We hope to see much of this honesty coming forth in the upcoming months that follow. While we know that doctrine cannot change – attitudes can. Let us all keep an open mind.
