Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. 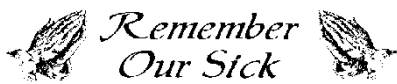

Reflections for

The Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary time

In today's gospel, we learn some interesting details about Jesus and his early life. Jesus' kinfolk know him to be a carpenter, an artisan who works in wood, stone, and metal. Mark describes Jesus as the son of Mary, which is an unusual designation. Adult males were more typically identified with the name of their fathers. Brothers and sisters of Jesus are also named. As Catholics, we believe that Mary was and remained always a virgin, thus we do not believe that this Gospel refers to other children of Mary. Some have suggested that these family members might be Joseph's children from a previous marriage, but there is little evidence to support this. Others explain this reference by noting that the words brother and sister were often used to refer to other types of relatives, including cousins, nieces, and nephews.

This Gospel tells us that Jesus is hampered from performing miracles in Nazareth because of the people's lack of faith. Jesus is said to be surprised by this. He did not predict or foresee this rejection. In this detail we find a description of the very human side of Jesus.

Who is Jesus? His kinfolk in Nazareth might know the carpenter, the son of Mary, but they do not know Jesus, the Son of God. Mark is foreshadowing Jesus' rejection by his own people.. He is also reflecting on and trying to explain the situation of the community for which he wrote. While many of the first Christians were Jewish, Christianity took hold and flourished in the Gentile community. By showing that Jesus himself was rejected, Mark consoles and reassures his first readers while preparing us to accept this possible consequence of Christian discipleship. *Loyola Press*

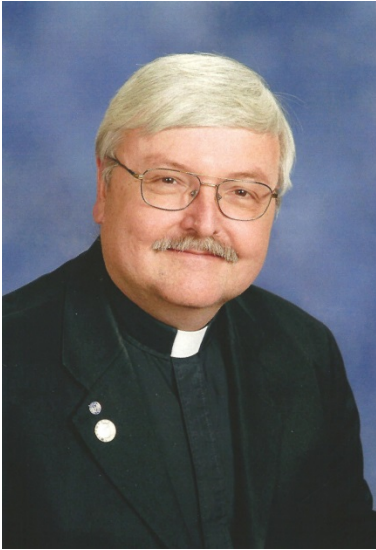

On this Fourth of July weekend, as I begin my assignment here at Visitation Parish, I thought I would tell a little about myself (don't worry, I'll try not to make it a habit!)

I was born in 1963, the oldest of three children to Donald and Dora (Leál) Blanchett. Moving from New York City to Lodi, N.J. when I was four years old, I have been a New Jerseyan ever since, living in Spotswood, Highland Park and Freehold. While attending high school at St. Mary's, South Amboy (which, until its sudden closing last month, was called Cardinal McCarrick HS) I met Mary Lee Sherbert and was married on August 16, 1986 after attending Rutgers University: I for a degree in Computer Science and she in Pharmacy. Working for fifteen years in various computer-related positions, we enjoyed eleven years of marriage until her death from leukemia at age 35 on All Souls Day,

November 2, 1997.

Following a call that had actually begun as discernment to the permanent diaconate, I joined the priesthood formation program for the diocese of Trenton. I attended Mt. Saint Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD from 1999-2004 and served diverse summer assignments in St. Catharine's, Spring Lake, St. Vincent de Paul, Yardville and Holy Trinity, Long Branch, taking one summer to attend a Spanish immersion program in Cuernavaca, Mexico. I was ordained a transitional Deacon on May 3, 2003 in my home parish of St. Gabriel's, Marlboro and as a Priest on May 15, 2004 in the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption in Trenton by Bishop John M. Smith.

After ordination, my first presbyteral assignment was at St. Mary of the Lake Parish in Lakewood as a Parochial Vicar with Fr. Michael O'Connor, current Pastor of neighboring Sacred Heart Parish in Bay Head. On January 4, 2008, Bishop Smith assigned me as Administrator to the merging parishes of St. Joseph's and St. Peter's; I was named the first Pastor of the newly-created parish of Jesus, the Good Shepherd on July 1, 2008. I served there until called by Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M. to become Pastor at St. Denis parish in Manasquan from July 2012 until June 2015. I worked to keep St. Denis School open (regrettably, it had to close last month) and was involved in reconstruction of the parish grounds and Beach Chapel due to the extensive damage suffered from Hurricane Sandy. I also serve as the spiritual director for the Trenton Diocese Cursillo Movement and on the Diocesan Commission for the New Evangelization and Social Media.

I am truly honored to have been called as shepherd to the faithful of the Church of the Visitation and hope to work with all of you for many happy and fruitful years. Together may we seek to best use the diverse talents and active ministries for the greater glory of God!

WHAT IS DISTINCTIVE ABOUT BEING A CATHOLIC?

Inquirers often ask about the “Catholic” difference. In answering, it first of all requires some understanding of the tradition from which the inquirer comes and what they use as their standard of comparison. A general answer that usually is helpful is to point out our Catholic appreciation for the sacramental dimension of the Christian faith. We Catholics believe that the holy can be communicated through the things of the earth, the “smells and bells” so to speak. At the heart of our experience of faith are the seven sacraments which are richly celebrated with strong rituals. We also cherish sacramentals, such as holy water, images of the saints, rosaries, blessed palms and ashes. Other distinctive features of our tradition include our understanding of the role of the Pope and Bishops as authoritative teachers; our way of interpreting Scripture in a non-fundamental way; the importance of Mary; the mother of Jesus in our faith and prayer; and the broad inclusivity of a global church that makes us truly “catholic,” that is universal, in our embrace of widely diverse cultures, socio-economic levels, and so forth.
