Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Reflections for the

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In John's Gospel, Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and the fishes is presented as a sign of his authority and divinity. Jesus interprets the meaning and significance of this miracle as a sharing of his Body and Blood. In many important ways, John's Gospel uses the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes to teach about the Eucharist. Like the Last Supper, this miracle is said to have occurred near the time of the Jewish feast of Passover. John's description of this event also anticipates the Messianic banquet of heaven, as the crowd reclines and all hungers are satisfied with abundance. This connection is further amplified by the response of the crowd, who wants to make Jesus a king.

John's Gospel tells the story of the Last Supper differently than the Synoptic Gospels. Instead of describing the meal and Jesus' actions with the bread and cup, John describes how Jesus washed his disciples' feet. We hear this Gospel when we remember the Last Supper on Holy Thursday. This recollection of Jesus' action at the Last Supper complements the institution narrative of the Synoptic Gospels and Paul's Letters that we hear repeated at each Mass.

In both stories about the Eucharist—the washing of the disciples' feet and the multiplication of the loaves and the fishes—the Gospel of John teaches us that the Eucharist is an action. Our word Eucharist is taken from the Greek language and describes an action: “to give thanks.” In the Eucharist we are fed by Jesus himself, and we are sent to serve others.

The story of the multiplication of the loaves and the fishes recalls a particular aspect of the Mass. In this miracle, Jesus transforms a young boy's offering of five barley loaves and two fish. In the offertory at Mass, we present the fruits of our labors, represented by bread and wine. These gifts, given to us first by God as grain and fruit, are returned to God in our offering of thanksgiving. God in turn transforms our gifts, making this bread and wine the very Body and Blood of Jesus. We also offer ourselves in this exchange, and we, too, are transformed by the Eucharist. *Loyola Press*

One of the most difficult liturgical decisions a pastor must make regards making changes to parish Mass schedules. After discussion, observation and prayer, I have decided that it is necessary to enact a change that had been proposed prior to my arrival. Starting January 2016 we will discontinue the Saturday 5:30PM weekend Mass and the Monday 7:30PM weekday Mass (please note that this *does not* affect 7:30AM weekday Masses.)

Removing Masses from a schedule is never a popular decision and I do not do so lightly. When it is done, it is keeping in mind both events that affect the parish today and potential impact of changes likely to happen in the future. Today, the cost in heating/cooling and lighting the church as well as in human terms (not only the limited resources of the priest and deacon, but also those in music and associated ministries) I believe make this change a prudent one. This change recognizes that, although we are blessed with Fr. Jim and our wonderful weekend priests, it is very likely that the number of priests available for Masses will not remain constant. Looking at long-term projections of the number of active priests in the diocese over the next few years make it imperative that we enact smaller changes now to minimize the disruption that will be caused by having to make more sweeping changes later.

I know that for some of you these Masses worked well in your schedules and I sincerely apologize for the inconvenience that this will cause. I would ask that you pray for our Church and that those called by God to serve in both ordained and lay ministries will heed and answer His call, bringing more shepherds and encouraging those who have strayed into the pasture of the faithful.
