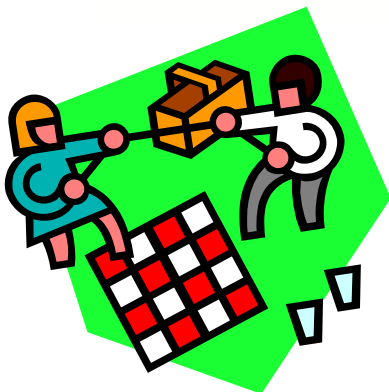

Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

*Reflections for the
Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Today's Gospel elaborates further on the teaching that Jesus began in our liturgy last week. In that reading, the crowds wondered about how Jesus could say that he had come down from heaven because they knew Jesus to be the son of Joseph. In this Gospel, some have difficulty with Jesus' teaching that he is the living bread sent from God. Recall that Jesus had told them that just as God gave the Israelites manna to sustain them in the desert, so now God has sent new manna that will give eternal life. We hear the concluding verse of last week's Gospel repeated in today's reading: Jesus himself is the bread sent by God; Jesus' flesh is the bread that is given for the life of the world.

Among the stumbling blocks for those who heard but did not understand Jesus is the teaching that the bread that Jesus will give is his own flesh. In response to the people who quarreled over his words, Jesus teaches with even greater emphasis that salvation comes to those who eat his Body and Blood. Jesus doesn't seem to answer the question posed about how salvation will come about, perhaps because this reality can only be understood after his death and Resurrection. Instead, Jesus teaches about the life that he will give to the world.

To many ears, Jesus' words are jarring and difficult to hear. Many who heard Jesus could not accept what he said. Many today continue to struggle to accept these words.

This is the mystery that is at the heart of our Eucharistic theology. In the elements of bread and wine, Jesus' Body and Blood are made truly present. When we share in the Body and Blood of Christ, Jesus himself comes to dwell within us. This communion with the Lord makes us one body, brings us eternal life, and sends us forth to be Christ's body for the life of the world. Jesus in the Eucharist will lead us to eternal life.

As we have been hearing what is called the "Bread of Life" discourse in the Gospel according to John these past few weekends, this is a great opportunity to review the guidelines for reception of Communion, especially in the hand. For complete information please see the U.S. Catholic Conference of Bishops document *The Reception Of Holy Communion At Mass*, which can be found on the Web at <http://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/the-mass/order-of-mass/liturgy-of-the-eucharist/the-reception-of-holy-communion-at-mass.cfm>).

Approved as an option for the United States by the Holy See in 1977, Communion in the hand is a return to custom from the earliest days of the Church. Although the universally-accepted norm of Communion on the tongue is still quite proper, many feel that receiving the Body of Christ in the hand allows a more personal relationship with the risen Jesus through the sacrament. However, careful examination is required due to the possibility of abuse – either unintended or otherwise – of the Blessed Sacrament when receiving in this way (and sadly in my years of distributing Communion, first as a lay Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion and later as a priest, I've seen far too many instances of irreverent reception.)

When receiving Communion in the hand, make a sign of respect (a simple bow of the head is sufficient) and approach the minister with one opened hand placed above the other: in this way, as St. Augustine once said, we "make our hands like a worthy throne for the Eucharist." After the minister says "The Body of Christ", respond "Amen". This indicates the Church's belief that this small wafer of bread, the wine in the chalice, are in reality the Body and Blood of Christ the Lord; which is why the response should *not* be something like "Thank you" or "I believe". When the Blessed Sacrament is placed in the hand – which hand it is will depend on whether you are right- or left-handed – step to one side and with the other hand immediately and reverently consume the Body of Christ. After receiving Communion return to your seat and offer a brief, silent thanksgiving.

If we give a moment's thought of whom we are receiving in the sacrament, we cannot help but to seek to do so in the best and most respectful way possible, both for ourselves and as a positive example to those around us who are receiving Jesus in this most special and loving sacrament.

To inaugurate this annual day of prayer on Tuesday, September 1, 2015, at 7:30 In the evening, Most Reverend David O'Connell, C.M., Bishop of Trenton, will celebrate Holy Mass at Our Lady Star of the Sea Chapel of St. Denis Parish --- the "Beach Chapel" at 554 E. Main Street in Manasquan, NJ, through the gracious hospitality of Reverend William Lago, pastor. This beautiful chapel holds about 450 people and will be an appropriate setting for this Mass as the sun sets over the Jersey shoreline. Interested faithful are welcome to join in the world-wide day of prayer, either at the chapel or in their personal prayer, and priests are invited to concelebrate.
