Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Reflections for the Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks the disciples for a field report by asking what others say about him. He then turns the question directly to the disciples and asks what they believe. Peter speaks for all of them when he announces that they believe Jesus to be the Christ.

The word Christ is the Greek translation of the Hebrew word for Messiah, which means “the anointed one.” At the time of Jesus, the image of the Messiah was laden with popular expectations, most of which looked for a political leader who would free the Jewish people from Roman occupation. Jesus does not appear to have used this term for himself. As we see in today's reading, Jesus refers to himself instead as the Son of Man, a term derived from the Jewish Scriptures, found in the Book of Daniel and in other apocryphal writings. Many scholars suggest that the phrase Son of Man is best understood to mean “human being.”

Now that the disciples have acknowledged Jesus as the Christ, Jesus confides in them the outcome of his ministry: he will be rejected, must suffer and die, and will rise after three days. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely. The image of Christ that Jesus is giving is not the image of the Messiah that Peter was expecting. Jesus then teaches the crowd and the disciples about the path of discipleship: To be Christ's disciple is to follow in the way of the cross.

We can easily miss the fear that Jesus' words must have evoked in his disciples. Death by crucifixion was all too familiar as a method of execution in Roman-occupied territories. It was also an omnipresent danger to the Christian community for whom Mark wrote. The path that Jesus was inviting his disciples to share meant tremendous suffering and death. This is the kind of radical commitment and sacrifice that Jesus calls us to adopt for the sake of the Gospel. *Loyola Press*

This week we remembered the 14th anniversary of the attacks on our nation – attacks that have left their mark on our country, the world, and in the hearts of far too many innocent people. As we listened to the stories and witnessed the heart-wrenching sadness of those who mourned the loss of life or lives of loved ones, we felt so helpless and ill-equipped to deal with a tragedy of such magnitude, and that had far-reaching implications.

In our society we are used to dealing with problems logically and with all the technology available to us. But we learned very quickly that technology has no solution for a broken heart. There was no magic formula to eliminate the emptiness that came from such a loss. We found ourselves posing the question: How do we who mourn get on with what sometimes seems like the chore of living? The only answer we had then – the only one that still makes any sense today – is that we cling to faith, which provides hope. Faith allows us to go on because we believe that nothing or no one in this world can take away that which is given to us by God. Yet, even this didn't take away the heartache of grief. It didn't take away the sense of inadequacy as we wondered what we could do, and then realized how little we had to offer. Faith is what gave us a reason and the ability and desire to find the joy of life. As we searched for answers over these past years we saw signs of God's love: sometimes in the valiant and heroic sacrifice of others, sometimes in the kindness, generosity and compassion poured out by so many to the suffering, many times in the prayers that were offered so constantly as people publicly and steadfastly clung to their faith.

As a community of faith and a nation, we continue to pray that our faith will always grow. We continue to pray for all who have died, for those who still mourn, for our families and friends, and for peace and justice in our world.

INFANT BAPTISM

Faith is never separated from the community of believers. Rather, "The Church's faith precedes the faith of the believer who is invited to adhere to it." (CCC 1124) Keep in mind that we have all received the faith from someone else. "When the Church celebrates the sacraments, she confesses the faith received from the apostles" (CCC 1124) and "It is only within the faith of the Church that each of the faithful can believe." (CCC 1253)

All of us are actually baptized on the faith of the community of believers rather than our own faith. Infants are dependent upon the faith of their parents for baptism as God grants the graces of baptism at the request of the parent rather than the infant. Infant baptism exemplifies the "sheer gratuitousness of the grace of salvation" (CCC 1250) which comes from God alone. God reaches down to us as a free gift which we in no way deserve, whether we are an adult or an infant. In Baptism we become freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ..."(CCC 1213).

THE PELICAN



On the face of our altar is a pelican feeding its young. Our Roman Catholic tradition tells us that this bird is a wonderful visible sign of Jesus. Like the pelican, Jesus sustains his own, feeding us with his body and blood. The life that is nurtured and grows in the young pelican is a sign of our own eternal life which is nourished by the body and blood of Christ.

Watching pelicans today as they soar majestically in good or bad weather, illustrates to us that the Church, despite good or bad experiences through the ages, continues to soar majestically. Just as humans have by our failures and shortcomings, sometimes unintentional, almost succeeded to cause the pelican to be extinct, still it flies. So too does our Church remain strong and vibrant because Christ promised, despite our human failings and shortcomings, that not even the gates of hell will prevail against her.

It is said that pelicans mate for life and take great care of their offspring. They nourish their young by catching and eating fish, predigesting it, and then regurgitating it for the babies. Because the adult's breast would be stained through this process, it was believed that the pelican would actually wound itself, by pecking at its own chest until blood was drawn, so that its blood could nourish its young. This belief led to the pelican becoming a symbol of Christ who wounded himself to feed us. It is a beautiful Eucharistic symbol that is not biblical, but rather comes from the tradition of the Church. It is a symbol that has been used for centuries. St. Thomas, in beautiful poetry for the Feast of Corpus Christi, calls Christ "Pie Pelicane Jesu Domine" which translates to: "Pious Pelican, Jesus the Lord". The pelican symbolizes for us, therefore, the sacrifice Jesus made for us: He opened His life to death so that we might live; He shed His blood so that we can have eternal life.

Be sure to notice that we have a symbol of Christ right before our eyes - on our sacred altar - the pelican pecking itself and drawing its own blood to sustain her children.

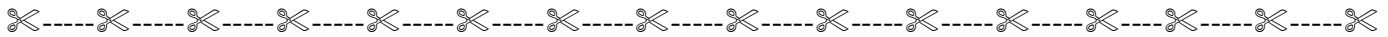
