Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

*Reflections for the
Twenty Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time*

In today’s gospel the Pharisees question Jesus about the lawfulness of divorce. Under specific conditions, divorce was an accepted practice among the Jewish people during the time of Jesus. It was regulated by the Law of Moses, as found in Deuteronomy 24:1-5. This law only permits that a husband may divorce his wife if he finds her to be indecent. This is the justification that the Pharisees reference when Jesus inquires about the commandment of Moses. In reply, Jesus quotes from the Book of Genesis and counters that God’s original intention was that men and women would become one flesh in marriage. Jesus describes the teaching of Moses as a concession made to God’s original intention because of human stubbornness.

In private, Jesus’ disciples question him further about this teaching on divorce. It is to his disciples that Jesus lays out the implications of his teaching by explaining that remarriage after divorce is adultery. Jesus’ teaching was more restrictive than the teaching of the Pharisees, which permitted remarriage.

At first glance, the final part of today’s Gospel seems unconnected to the previous teaching about divorce. When read together, however, these passages present a strong picture of Jesus’ emphasis on the importance of family. God intended for women and men to be joined together in marriage. Among the purposes of marriage is the raising of children. By welcoming children and fostering their relationship with God, parents and families bear witness to the Kingdom of God.

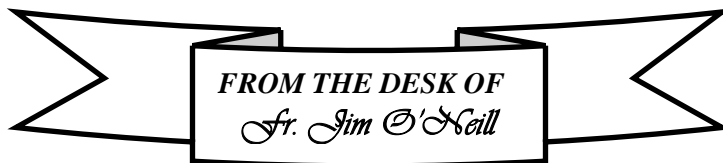
At the end of today’s Gospel, the people were bringing their children to Jesus, and again Jesus’ disciples show that they just don’t get it. Recall that in the Gospel for each of the past two Sundays, Jesus has taught his disciples the value and importance of these “little ones” in the Kingdom of God. Yet in today’s Gospel, the disciples try to prevent people from bringing their children to Jesus. Jesus reprimands his disciples and welcomes these children. Again Jesus offers these children as an example of the kind of complete trust and dependence upon God that ought to be the attitude of all believers. *Loyola Press*

FAMILIES

Last Sunday, my brother Kevin was particularly amused by the Pope's procession before the big papal Mass. At first glance the security guards seemed to be intensely looking for anyone who might harm the Holy Father. After a while, we figured they were spending more time looking for babies. Parents were holding their children up in the air, hoping a stranger would take their child to the Holy Father to be blessed and kissed by him. It was reminiscent of Jesus embracing children, blessing them, and saying:

"Let the children come to me, do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." (Mark 10:14-15)

On this Respect Life Sunday, we are reminded that Jesus loves each and every one of us from the moment of conception until the moment of death. If we have received His love, then we will have the eternal joy of being with Him forever in Heaven. Our theme for this Respect Life Sunday is "Every Life is Worth Living." Pope Francis emphasized care for those most in need. Among them, he often highlighted children by what he said and more powerfully by his gestures.

When Pope Francis addressed Congress, he said, "The Golden Rule also reminds us of our responsibility to protect and defend human life at every stage of development." He surely meant to include the pre-born and those who are frail, sick, poor, or on the brink of meeting Jesus face to face. After the speech to the rich and powerful, he went outside and highlighted the children. Instead of dining with Congress, he had lunch with the homeless.

In his homily last Sunday, Pope Francis did not explicitly mention the upcoming Synod on the Family, but he made an appeal to all of us to aim at "being open to miracles of love for the sake of all." Let us pray for the 200 or so people participating in the Synod on the Family that they would delve deeply into the meaning, joys, and challenges of family. May they provide the Holy Father with wonderful ideas so that he might lead us in helping families enter more deeply into God's divine plan for human love.
