Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Reflections for the Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, an unnamed man approaches Jesus and inquires about what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus replies that one must follow the commandments of the Law of Moses. The man acknowledges that he has observed all of these since his childhood. Jesus then says that only one thing is lacking: he must give his possessions to the poor and follow Jesus. The man leaves in sadness, and Mark tells us that this is because he had many possessions.

The belief in resurrection and eternal life was a relatively recent development in Jewish thought at Jesus' time, and it wasn't shared by everyone. Jesus taught that there would be a final judgment for everyone and eternal life (the Kingdom of God) for believers.

Jesus makes two requirements of the wealthy man who approaches him. First, he must give up his possessions. Throughout history, some Christians have taken this literally. Their example witnesses to us a radical commitment to the Gospel of Jesus. Some have read this as a particular requirement directed to this specific individual. Still others have sought to explain the meaning intended by the word possessions as those things that prevent one from following Jesus. Christians have generally understood that at the least, following Jesus requires that believers hold material possessions loosely and remain vigilant against seeking security in accumulating possessions.

The second requirement Jesus makes of this man is the invitation that Jesus extends to all would-be disciples: "follow me." Jesus very much wants this man to be his disciple. We believe that the Christian faith is one in which each believer is in a personal relationship with Jesus. Just as this Gospel tells us that Jesus loves the man and is sad when he departs, so too, Jesus loves us and is saddened when we are unable to follow him.

Peter replies to Jesus by boasting that the disciples have already given up everything. Jesus acknowledges that those who have given up everything for the sake of the Gospel will be rewarded. This reward begins now, in the new community that one will gain in this life, and will continue in the eternal age to come. Our personal relationship with Jesus is also an invitation to the community of faith, the Church. *Loyola Press*

With all of the recent media coverage regarding Pope Francis' visit to the U.S. we may have forgotten another event the Holy Father has scheduled, one that began last Sunday: the Synod of Bishops on the Family. This is the fourteenth such Synod (also known as an "Ordinary General Assembly") since the practice was established in Pope Paul VI in 1965 and is a direct continuation of the Extraordinary Synod that took place last year, which worked to define the current state of the family and the challenges that face it.

The task of the bishops during this time will be to reflect further on the points discussed during the Extraordinary Synod and to formulate appropriate guidelines for the pastoral care of the person and the family. The anticipated result of these episcopal meetings is a document from the Holy Father, known as a "post-synodal Apostolic Exhortation", which will take up the themes of the Synod and deepen them further for instruction to Church leaders and all the faithful. A previous example of this process was the 1981 promulgation of Familiaris Consortio by Pope St. John Paul II on the role of Christian families in society.

For the current Synod, the bishops will use the working document that resulted from the 2014 Extraordinary Synod, Instrumentum Laboris, to guide their discussions. In support of the Church during this most crucial time for families, I would also encourage you to pray for our bishops using the Prayer for the Synod: Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in you we contemplate the splendor of true love, to you we turn with trust.

Holy Family of Nazareth, grant that our families too may be places of communion and prayer, authentic schools of the Gospel and small domestic Churches.

Holy Family of Nazareth, may families never again experience violence, rejection and division: may all who have been hurt or scandalized find ready comfort and healing.

Holy Family of Nazareth, may the approaching Synod of Bishops make us once more mindful of the sacredness and inviolability of the family, and its beauty in God's plan.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, graciously hear our prayer.

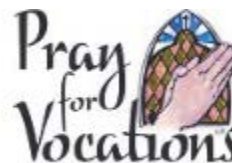

The Universal Church allows for lay people who have been **properly trained** to distribute Communion, including to the homebound. This training includes theological and spiritual aspects as well as practical aspects surrounding the distribution of Holy Communion. It is important that proper respect and adherence to Universal Church teaching is maintained at all times. When the Blessed Sacrament is administered outside of Mass, it must be transported in an appropriate vessel. If the person is unable to attend Mass for a period of time, please call the Rectory Office at 732-477-7059 ext. 216 during office hours so that we can schedule a Eucharistic Minister to visit the home.
