Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

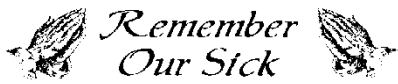

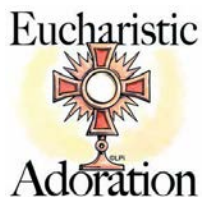

Reflections for

The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary time

In Luke's Gospel, the people are surprised but not immediately offended by Jesus' words in the synagogue. It is the words that follow his reading from the prophet Isaiah that seem to offend them. Jesus challenges and provokes the people of Nazareth by referring to examples in which Israel rejected the prophets. He also challenges them to respond to his message, the message of a prophet, in a way that is different from their ancestors. This call for a new response leads to his rejection.

It is helpful to consider the historical context of Luke's Gospel. Luke has witnessed the acceptance of the gospel message among many Gentiles. He endeavors to explain why the Good News of Jesus has not been as well-received by his Jewish contemporaries. Luke's report interprets the cause of Jesus' rejection at Nazareth in the context of this later Christian history. Just as the people at Nazareth did not welcome the Good News that Jesus announced, so too many among the people of Israel will not accept the preaching of the gospel.

After Jesus' words of challenge, Luke reports that there was a movement to kill Jesus by throwing him over a cliff. This differs from the reports found in Mark and Matthew's Gospels, where Jesus is said to be unable to perform miracles in Nazareth because of the people's lack of faith. Luke says that Jesus walks away from the crowd that intended to kill him; it is not yet his time. The animosity of the people of Nazareth prefigures and prepares the reader of Luke's Gospel for the cross. Luke wants all to understand that it is through his death on the cross that Jesus offers God's salvation to all. . . *Loyola Press*

THE PELICANS

On the face of our altar is a pelican feeding its young. Our tradition tells us that this bird is a wonderful visible sign of Jesus. Like the pelican Jesus sustains his own, feeding us with his body & blood. The life that is nurtured and grows in the young pelican is a sign of our own eternal life which is nourished by the body & blood of Christ.

Watching pelicans today as they soar majestically in good or bad weather, illustrates to us that the Church, despite good or bad experiences through the ages, still soars majestic. Just as humans have by our failures and shortcomings tried to eradicate the pelican, whether intentional or not, still it flies. So too the Church. Despite our human failings and shortcomings the Church remains, strong and vibrant because Christ promised that not even the gates of hell will prevail against her.

It is said that the pelicans mate for life and take great care of their offspring. The pelican will actually wound itself so that its blood could nourish the young. It will peck at its own chest to draw blood to feed its young. Pelicans may not actually draw their own blood to feed their young but they do catch fish, predigest them and then feed their children. The tradition got started when people saw the blood and thought the pelicans fed their own blood to their children, and therefore it became a symbol of Christ who has wounded himself to feed us. It is a beautiful Eucharistic symbol that is not biblical but comes from the tradition of the Church. St. Thomas in beautiful poetry for the Feast of Corpus Christi, calls Christ "Pie Pelicane Jesu Domine" which translates to "Pious Pelican, Jesus the Lord".

Yes, the pelican has long been used by the Church as a symbol of Christ and the Eucharist because the pelican, to sustain its young, feeds the young birds its own flesh and blood through the sacrifice of plucking that flesh from its own chest. It is thought that the pelican tears open its breast to bring life with its own blood and can be for us a living representation of what Jesus does for us. Opening his life to death so that we may live; shedding his blood so that we can have eternal life.

Once again, we have a symbol of Christ right before our very eyes - on our sacred altar - the pelican pecking itself and drawing its own blood to sustain her children.

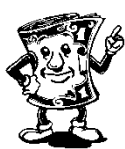
FOREVER IN OUR HEARTS

INSTRUCT THE IGNORANT

This is an extremely important category today. There are so many people who are confused by what the Church teaches and about what is and what is not sin. They want to know what constitutes a real marriage; what birth control methods are approved or disapproved; what is the church teaching on Euthanasia and so forth. We should make certain that we are informed so that when asked we can offer a true explanation. There are many sources where we can enlighten ourselves. There are many Catholic books, including the Catechism of the Catholic Church, Matthew Kelly – Discovering Catholicism/Discovering Jesus, etc. as well as websites such as Catholic.com, Catholicnet.com, USCCB.org, Beliefnet.com and such. Or there is always the method of asking someone who should know like our Priests and Deacons. Especially in this year of Mercy we need to make certain we know the truth about what the church teaches and to profess that truth in the marketplace. People are being led astray by what the world is teaching them. We need to gently, quietly call them back to the truth.

ADULTS and TEENS who wish to receive the **Sacrament of Confirmation**, sessions are now forming. Confirmation, like baptism, is a sacrament of initiation into the Christian life. It is a sacrament that Jesus Christ instituted within his Catholic Church to further strengthen those who have reached adulthood.

To receive the sacrament it is required that you have received Baptism and Holy Communion in the Catholic Church. You should be an active Catholic and, if married, your marriage should be in accordance with the laws of the Church.
