Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

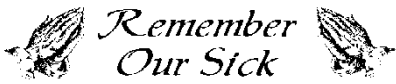

The Second Sunday in Lent

The Transfiguration occurs on a mountain in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples—Peter, James and John. Only Luke's Gospel, which often describes Jesus at prayer, indicates that Jesus is praying as his appearance changes to bright white. The three disciples were sleeping while Jesus prayed. They will be sleeping again as Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane before his Passion and death.

As they awake, Peter and the disciples see Jesus Transfigured and Elijah and Moses present with Jesus. Elijah and Moses, both significant figures in the history of Israel, represent Jesus' continuity with the Law and the Prophets. Only Luke's Gospel explains that this conversation is about Jesus' later accomplishments in Jerusalem. Luke describes this as his exodus, connecting Jesus' Passion, death, and Resurrection with the Israel's Exodus from Egypt.


On witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, Peter offers to construct three tents for them. Having just awoken, perhaps Peter's offer was made in confusion. We also notice that Peter reverted from his earlier confession that Jesus is the Messiah, calling Jesus “master” instead. As if in reply to Peter's confusion, a voice from heaven speaks, affirming Jesus as God's Son and commanding that the disciples listen to him. This voice from heaven recalls the voice that was heard at Jesus' baptism which, in Luke's Gospel, spoke directly to Jesus as God's Son.

In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, the disciples keep secret what they have seen. Not until they also witness his Passion and death will the disciples understand Jesus' Transfiguration. We hear this story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection even as we prepare to remember Jesus' Passion and death. *Loyola Press*

Last weekend, those who attended the 11:00 Mass were treated to a celebration of the *Rite of Sending Catechumens for Election by the Bishop*. That afternoon, I was privileged to assist during the *Rite of Election* at the Cathedral in Trenton as Bishop O’Connell welcomed from all parishes in the Diocese those being presented for Election into the Catholic Church.

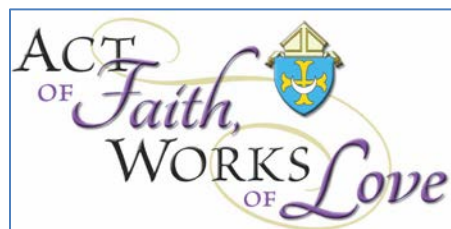
On this second Sunday of Lent I would like to bring you up to date on the individual at Visitation Parish for whom this season holds a particular importance: the catechumenate member (now known as “the Elect”) of our RCIA (“Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults”) who is seeking to receive her sacraments of initiation. This year, we are blessed to be helping **Nicole Kindnerski** on her journey to Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church. God willing, she will be Baptized, Confirmed and receive First Eucharist at the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday night, March 26th. She has been attending our RCIA sessions and receiving instruction in the Catholic faith. During the weekends of Lent we as a parish will be joining her in prayer as she strives to complete the process of formal catechesis (teaching in the faith). This includes Nicole’s reception of the *Scrutinies*, an ancient series of rites in which she is further invited to reflect on her journey and what Christ means to her in the life of faith.

If you see Nicole at the 4 o’clock Mass, in addition to keeping her in your prayers, I would also ask you to reflect upon your own journey in the faith this Lent. One point that our catechists stress to the RCIA members is that we never *really* finish learning about our Catholic faith. Much like our love for God upon which our faith is based, it is a process that literally takes all of our lives and beyond. Whether you joined the Church through the RCIA or you have been a Catholic since your parents brought you to Church for Baptism soon after birth, it’s a mistake to ever think we’ve “graduated” from the school of faith formation. Just as our soon-to-be initiated member is doing, I invite you, if it’s been a while, to once again inquire about *your* faith, ask the questions you may have and do your best to seek the answers. I think that in this way we can re-capture the beauty and relevance of our faith and be better prepared to witness to it in a world that has lost its way. What a great gift to give to yourself and those around you in preparing for the joy of Easter!

LENT INSTRUCTION

The days of **fast and abstinence** are **ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY**.

The other **Fridays of Lent** are **DAYS OF ABSTINENCE**.

Those between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine are obliged to fast. By this obligation, the individual is permitted only one full meal a day.

At the age of fourteen, people are obliged to abstain. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Missing abstinence on any one (1) Friday is not a serious sin. Missing abstinence most of the Fridays of Lent (or more than half of them) is a serious sin that needs to be confessed & absolved.

The obligation of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 14, to Trinity Sunday, May 22**. However, the Code of Canon Law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

PALM



With Palm Sunday just around the corner, some of you may be wondering what you should do with last year's palm once you receive this year's. There will be a basket for Palm in the narthex of the church. You may drop off your old Palm to be burned at this year's Easter Vigil.

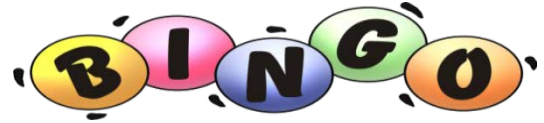

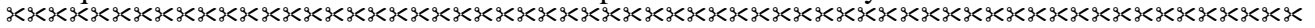
