Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

(Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. 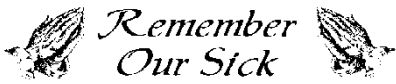

Today we begin the Easter Season, our 50-day meditation on the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. Our Gospel today tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb. It concludes by telling us that they did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead. Thus, the details provided are not necessarily meant to offer proof of the Resurrection, but to invite us to reflect upon a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection.

Each of the four Gospels tells us that Jesus' empty tomb was first discovered by women. In the case of John's Gospel, the only woman attending the tomb is Mary of Magdala. Unlike the Synoptic accounts, John's Gospel does not describe an appearance of angels at the tomb. Instead, Mary is simply said to have observed that the stone that had sealed the tomb had been moved, and she runs to alert Simon Peter and the beloved disciple. She assumes that Jesus' body has been removed, perhaps stolen. She does not consider that Jesus has been raised from the dead.

Simon Peter and the beloved disciple race to the tomb, presumably to verify Mary's report. The beloved disciple arrives first but does not enter the tomb until after Simon Peter. This detail paints a vivid picture, as does the detail provided about the burial cloths. Some scholars believe that the presence of the burial cloths in the tomb offers evidence to the listener that Jesus' body had not been stolen.

The Gospel passage concludes, however, that even having seen the empty tomb and the burial cloths, the disciples do not yet understand about the Resurrection. In the passage that follows, Mary of Magdala meets Jesus but mistakes him for the gardener. In the weeks ahead, the Gospel readings from our liturgy will show us how the disciples came to believe in Jesus' Resurrection through his appearances to them. Our Easter faith is based on their witness to both the empty tomb and their continuing relationship with Jesus—in his appearances and in his gift of the Holy Spirit.

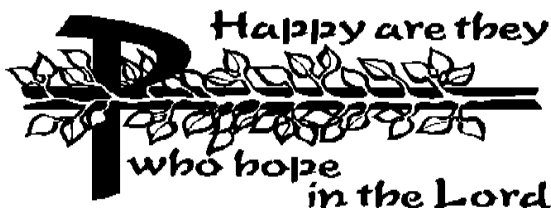

Let us rejoice and give praise, the Lord is Risen as he promised, alleluia!!

On this Easter Sunday, we can experience and celebrate signs of spring. Many regions in our country will find trees budding, flowers popping their heads out of the ground and birds returning. These are all signs of the renewal of the season. As Easter children, we also will experience another sign of renewal—a spiritual renewal as we celebrate our resurrection from the tomb of eternal damnation. Easter invites us to go forth telling the story of a God who so loved the people of the world that he sent his only son to be sacrificed for them. Because of Jesus' actions, we can experience a true peace because we have forgiveness and eternal life.

True peace is available to everyone, not from the material things of this world, but from a sharing in the peace of Christ. Such a peace is available to anyone who accepts the resurrection of Jesus. The key to obtaining the "peace" that Christ offers is to be found in our relationship with the Holy Spirit. Our part of the transaction is to believe and to recognize Jesus Christ as our Messiah, our Lord and our Savior. Christ's part is to send the Holy Spirit. The paschal candle will shine during the Easter season. May it remind us of our new life in our Risen Lord. May it remind us to rejoice, always, in good days and bad, with steady hope. May the paschal candle also remind us that the light of the risen Christ shines in the world through the oil of our lives. Let us also go forth and tell our story as Secular Franciscans to others. Where we work to make a better world, there we are spreading his sincerity and his truth. RCIA CORNER

EASTER VIGIL

Alleluia! He is risen! His rising is the promise of life for us all! We rejoice in the mercy and power of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ raised from the dead. We rejoice in the faith of our Neophyte, Nicole Rita Kindnersky, who was made one with Him and with us, His body, through the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. We continue to pray for her, for her family and for all those in this community who still are seeking Christ in this Church community.

The Easter Vigil celebrates the resurrection of our Lord and the faith of believers. It begins with the service of light where we witness the new fire, new hope and new faith. The community gathers in darkness to hear that Christ is our light, shattering the darkness of sin. The second part of the Vigil is the Liturgy of the Word. We hear the story of salvation that talks about Abraham and Moses and ends with the Gospel of the resurrection.

The third part is the Baptismal Liturgy. Our Catechumen has been counted among the Elect at the Rite of Election. She was plunged into the waters of Baptism into a new birth. Anointed with chrism, she celebrated Confirmation, receiving the strength of God's Spirit for the Christian life. Together we professed our faith in the resurrection and promised to follow Christ more closely.

The Vigil culminates with the Liturgy of the Eucharist. As a Community of Faith we came forward with our Elect to receive the body and blood of our Lord. From this day forward our newly baptized will join us in the Eucharistic feast. We pray for all our Neophytes who have entered fully into the faith this Easter and pray that they be a living example of faith in Jesus Christ.
