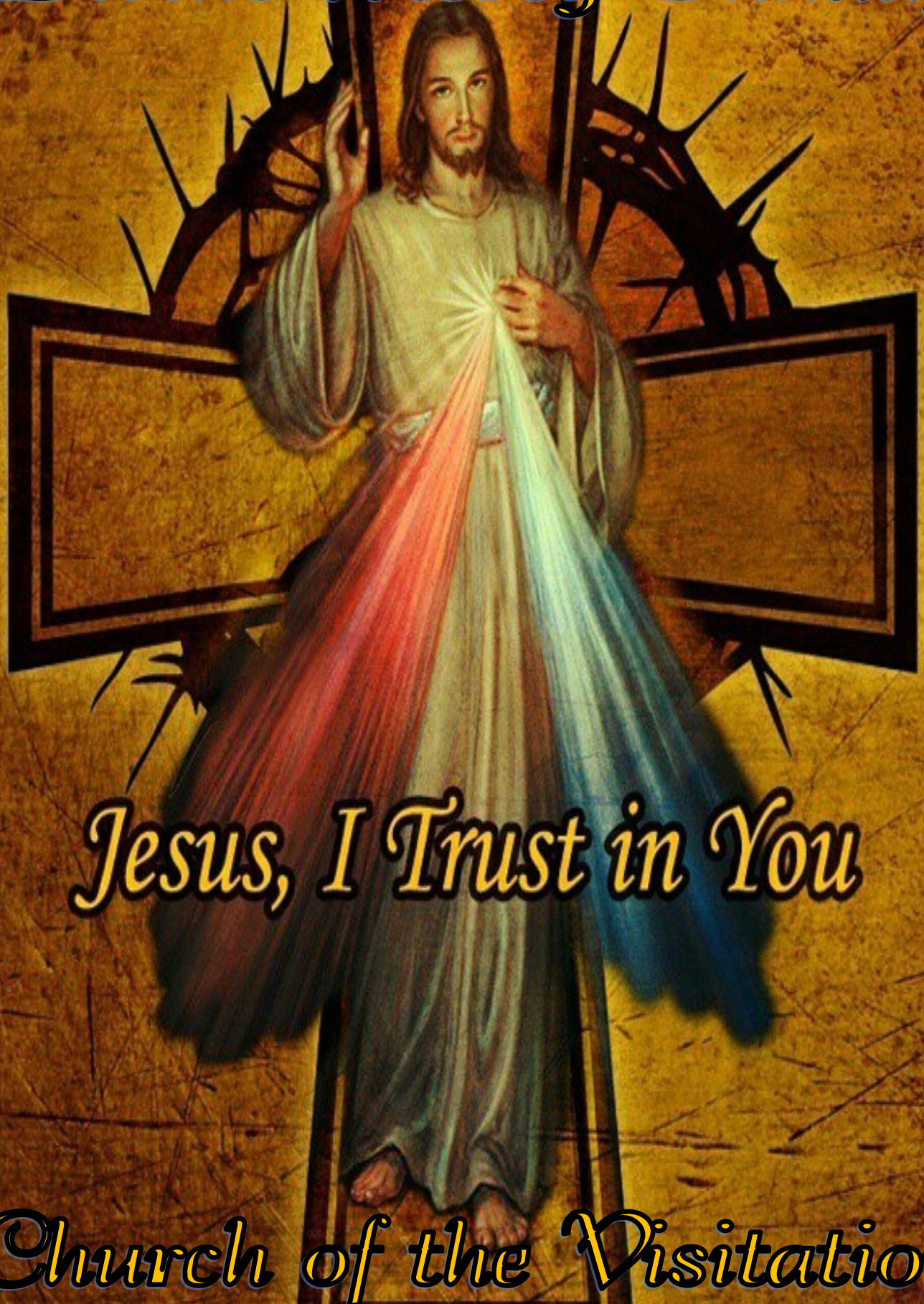

Parish Registration

Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Anointing of the Sick

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

Penance/Reconciliation

Saturday from 3:15 to 3:45PM in the Church or anytime by appointment. A Penance Service is held during Advent and Lent.

Religious Education (CCD)

Reflections for Divine Mercy Sunday

In today's Gospel, Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus also commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun. As Jesus was sent by God, so too does Jesus send his disciples. This continuity with Jesus' own mission is an essential element of the Church. Jesus grants the means to accomplish this mission when he gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit binds us together as a community of faith and strengthens us to bear witness to Jesus' Resurrection.

Jesus' words to his disciples also highlight the integral connection between the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Forgiveness and reconciliation are gifts to us from Jesus. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we can share these with others. This is another essential aspect of what it means to be Christ's Church. The Church continues Jesus' ministry of forgiveness and reconciliation.

Thomas, the disciple who doubts, represents the reality of the Church that comes after this first community of disciples. All but the first disciples of Jesus must believe without seeing. Like Thomas, we may doubt the news that Jesus, who was crucified and buried, appeared to his disciples. It is part of our human nature to seek hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death is, indeed, the same Jesus who was crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to be our representative who obtains this evidence. He gives witness to us that the Jesus who was raised is the same Jesus who had died. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are among those who are blessed for we have not seen and yet have believed.

FROM THE DESK OF

DIVINE MERCY

Do you remember what you were doing on Saturday, April 2, 2005? I was driving to visit my dying brother in Point Pleasant, Pennsylvania, when I heard that Pope John Paul II was very close to death. He died that night at 9:37 p.m., Roman time. It was the Vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday. In 2000, JP2 instituted the feast and canonized the apostle of Divine Mercy, St. Faustina Kowalska.

April 2, 2005, was also the First Saturday, a Marian devotion connected to Our Lady of Fatima. That apparition included a prophesy of a bishop in white falling to the ground. Our Lady of Fatima guided the bullet around John Paul's vital organs on May 13, 1981.

Also in 2005, Good Friday occurred on March 25th, the most important day of the year. We normally celebrate the Annunciation and Incarnation on March 25th. It is also the day that Jews believe the world was created and Abraham nearly sacrificed his son Isaac. Early Christians wondered if Jesus died on March 25th. Good Friday occurs on March 25th in 1921, 1932, 2005, 2016, and 2157. This rarity seems connected to Divine Mercy since JP2's first Holy Week after his May 1920 birth was in 1921. He was called home to the Father's House in 2005. And we are now in the midst of the Jubilee Year of Mercy.

We very much need Divine Mercy, especially after the horrors of the early 20th century which seem to continue in other forms to the present day. How fitting it was that the Lord would call St. John Paul home to the Father's house during the celebration of Divine Mercy.

I visited JP2 on the feast of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, January 4, 2003. In four seconds flat, I asked him to "Please pray for my brother Patrick." After JP2's death, we asked for his intercession for my brother. We didn't receive the miraculous cure we were requesting, but my brother looked ecstatic on the night before his death. I wonder if he saw his guardian angel or Jesus in a way similar to what we're hearing in the Scriptures during this Easter Season.

When the cross is heavy, we plead for Divine Mercy. God is thrilled to love us to wholeness, to one day share in His Son's Resurrection. Don't wait until the cross is too heavy. Let's ask for Divine Mercy today. I invite you to join us for our Divine Mercy celebration. Each Sunday Mass is a Divine Mercy Mass. We will have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after the 12:30 p.m. Mass. Fr. Ed and I will hear confessions until 3 p.m. when we will pray the Divine Mercy chaplet. Our celebration concludes with Benediction.

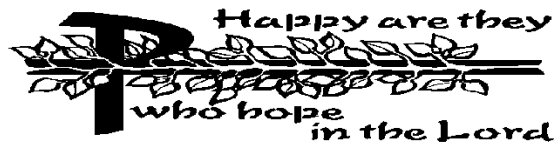

## RCIA CORNER

### **BAPTISM**

In the Gospel of John Jesus answers Nicodemus when he asks what he must do to gain salvation: Jesus answered, "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. (John 10:5)

Baptism is the first sacrament and necessary for salvation. Baptism is a door to the church and an entrance into new life. It incorporates us into the body of Christ and we become adopted children of God. Baptism not only removes sin, but also the punishment for sin.

There are 3 criteria for a valid Baptism:

1. The intention must be there to Baptized. In other words, the person, or the parents and Godparents must want Baptism for the candidate
2. The water must be poured – Jesus told the woman at the well that he had living water to give her, holy water that was not hemmed in or that any well could contain, water that she would never again thirst for. The water at Baptism is this living water and that is why the person must either have the water poured over them or be immersed in it; and
3. The Trinity must be invoked.

Sanctifying, holy grace is given as are supernatural gifts and added virtue. All of this to enable the baptized to live out their life in holiness. We have not been left alone to our own devices but the Holy Spirit has been poured into our hearts for our edification. We grow each day more and more in grace. This is why Baptism is the first and most important sacrament. It is God's way of enabling us to lead a good Christian life.

Let us keep our newly Baptized, our Neophyte, Nicole Rita Kindnersky in our prayers.
