Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Reflections for The Fowth Sunday of Easter

The fourth Sunday of Easter is also called Good Shepherd Sunday. In each of the three lectionary cycles, the Gospel is taken from the tenth chapter of the Gospel of John. This chapter of John's Gospel follows Jesus' healing of the man born blind and the rejection of this miracle by Jewish leaders who question Jesus' authority to heal. Jesus responds to this challenge to his authority by calling himself the Good Shepherd. He is criticizing the Pharisees and other Jewish leaders. Already, the Pharisees and other Jewish leaders are so angered that they attempt to stone and arrest Jesus (see John 10:31 and 10:39). This controversy with the religious leaders continues until Jesus' death.

Set in a moment of tension and conflict in John's Gospel, today's Gospel reading is Jesus' answer to the question, "Are you the Messiah?" Jesus responds by saying, in essence, "If you have to ask, then you are not one of my sheep." Then Jesus asserts his unity with the Father. At the conclusion of these words, John reports that the Jews intend to stone Jesus for blasphemy, but he escapes arrest.

We may be less familiar with the metaphors of sheep and shepherd than those to whom Jesus spoke. The image of Jesus as Good Shepherd and the community of followers as his sheep has endured over the centuries as a primary image in our faith tradition. Its power to describe the relationship between Jesus and his followers transcends direct experience with sheep. The image speaks to us about the protection, security, and care that shepherds represent for their sheep.

Today's Gospel speaks powerfully about the familiarity and intimacy between Jesus and his disciples, expressed as recognizing and knowing another's voice. Today's Gospel also speaks to the relationship between Jesus and the Father. In the Gospel of John, Jesus identifies so closely with the Father that he tells us that they are one—not just close, but actually one. To know Jesus is to know the Father. Jesus doesn't just bring us closer to the Father, Jesus puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us. Our relationship with Jesus is an invitation to share in the life of God

This Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Easter, is known in the Church as *Good Shepherd Sunday*. Listening to the readings during Mass, which teach Jesus as the chief Shepherd, makes this evident. It also signals, starting this weekend and continuing at different Masses throughout April and May, the celebration with our young people who are receiving Jesus for the very first time in Communion. This common element of Jesus leading and feeding us is so important for reflection today.

All of us, both young and old, as followers of Christ are part of the sheepfold that we call the Church. It is through the Church that he shares his life with us. He shares in his Word proclaimed at Mass and set down in the Scriptures; in the Sacraments that engage all of our senses (seeing, hearing, touching, tasting, smelling) as we draw closer to him; in the riches of his grace to light up our way and guide our steps are we move closer to our Heavenly home. These actions involve the participation by all of the faithful. This is how we enter into the full, active and conscious participation of our faith, as outlined by the Second Vatican Council (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 14). It should begin at the earliest possible age so that it can take root as something that is integral to our lives and not simply another item on our weekly "to do" list. It is also something that must be fed and nurtured carefully as our young people grow so that it does not undergo spiritual starvation; how many of today's First Communicants will retain their sense of awe and wonder to be followers of Jesus when it is time for them to receive Confirmation?

As each of us is called to follow the Good Shepherd, we are also called – each in our own way – to be shepherds as well: reaching out and guiding the lost, teaching and feeding those entrusted to our care. As we are led and fed, may God "lead us to a share in the joys of heaven, so that the humble flock may reach where the brave Shepherd has gone before" (*Collect* for the Fourth Sunday of Easter).

I invite you to join us in our parish Mission starting this at Masses this weekend and continuing through morning (following the 8:15AM Mass) and nightly 7-9PM sessions in the church this Sunday 4/17 through Wednesday 4/20. Bill Wegner of Good News International Ministries will offer insights into *God's Mercy*, *Our Mercy*, so appropriate during this Jubilee Year of Mercy. I look forward to seeing you at any conferences you can attend – and bring a friend!
