Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

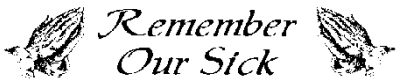

Reflections for Pentecost Sunday



The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The story of Pentecost is found in the Acts of the Apostles, today's first reading. The account in today's Gospel, taken from the Gospel of John, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts to each other. It is enough to know that, after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world.

We previously heard today's Gospel on the second Sunday of Easter. At that time, we also heard the passage that follows, which describes Jesus' appearance to Thomas. In that context, we were led to reflect on belief and unbelief.

In the context of the feast of Pentecost, this reading reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." As he breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, Jesus sends his disciples to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins.

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. This reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are washed clean from sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God in forgiving sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people. *Loyola Press*

This Sunday, Pentecost, marks the end of the Easter season (yes, we've been in Easter for the last 50 days!) and a return to the period of Ordinary Time in the Church calendar.

It also signifies a very special time for a number of people in our parish. At the 9:30 Mass this Sunday I will have the privilege of conferring the sacrament of Confirmation to a number of adults in our parish (Dana-Lynn, Cassidy, Yoally, Jacqueline, Gema and Richard Jude); and on Wednesday the Very Rev. Stanley Lukasewski, Episcopal Vicar for Ocean County, will confer the sacrament upon the young people in our parish Religious Education program. Truly, these are marvelous and most appropriate ways to celebrate the feast marking the Descent of the Holy Spirit.

As a reminder – although I'm sure you remember this from your own CCD days – receiving the sacrament of Confirmation confers a number of gifts from the Holy Spirit: ***Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Knowledge, Fortitude, Piety, and Fear of the Lord***. If you need a refresher on these, you can get more information from the U.S. bishops' website at <http://www.usccb.org/about/justice-peace-and-human-development/upload/Confirmation-handout.pdf>. These gifts empower those fully initiated into the Catholic faith to go into the world and be a witness by their words and actions to the Spirit and the Church that Christ founded. The graces that these gifts impart don't end when we receive the sacrament but remain with us every day of our lives. This is the *indelible mark* that Confirmation makes upon our souls; one that we can never lose, but must continually employ our will to draw upon it so that it can bear fruit in our lives.

As a parish, we congratulate those who will receive this sacrament. I also pray that, through our support and gentle encouragement of the gifts that these individuals receive in Confirmation, they may become shining lights of our faith, helping to light the way for themselves and others the path of truth in a darkened world.

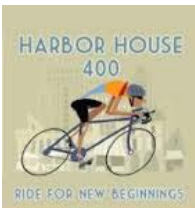
THE OIL OF THE CATECHUMENS O.C. OR O.S. "OLEUM CATECHUMENORUM"

The Oil of Catechumens is used in in the sacrament of baptism.

In our current baptismal liturgies, the priest offers the prayer of exorcism and then anoints the person to be baptized on the chest, saying, "We anoint you with the oil of salvation in the name of Christ our Savior; may He strengthen you with His power, who lives and reigns forever and ever."

This oil is also used to anoint our Catechumens. Anointing with the Oil of Catechumens following a prayer of exorcism may take place during the period of the Catechumentate on one or several occasions. In both cases this anointing symbolizes the person's need for the help and strength of God to sever the bondage of the past and to overcome the opposition of the devil so that they may profess their faith, come to baptism, and live as a child of God.

SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home shed a ray of light divine!



In today's liturgy, before the Gospel Acclamation, we sing the great Pentecost Sequence: a song of praise to the Holy Spirit, in Latin known as *Veni Sancte Spiritus*. This song dates back to

the thirteenth century (attributed to Pope Innocent III) and is a beautifully poetic prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to come and to shine divine light on all humanity.

Using stirring titles, the prayer calls on the Holy Spirit to come down upon us. It gives witness to the work of the Holy Spirit in the life of the world. If our souls are weary, it reminds us, the Holy Spirit brings us rest; in the heat of temptation, the Holy Spirit brings graceful coolness; if our souls are heavy and burdened by sorrow, the Holy Spirit consoles us.

The prayer continues, asking the Holy Spirit to wash us, to bring healing to the injured soul, to soften the hardened heart, to warm the cold-hearted, and to lead the lost. It ends by asking the Holy Spirit to give the seven holy gifts, to give reward to the virtuous and to lead us through death to salvation.

There are various translations of the sequence set to music. As the Easter season comes to a close, find a copy of this prayer. Pray it at various times today, in observance of Pentecost. Pray it throughout the coming seasons. Pray it whenever you are in need of a reminder of God's great love and care, given to us through the Holy Spirit. *Veni, Sancte Spiritus! Holy Spirit, Come! Alleluia!*
