Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

*Reflections for
The Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

In Chapter 12 of Luke's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples and the crowd on how to be ready for the coming judgment. A crowd of many thousands has gathered to hear Jesus. At first he speaks only to the disciples, reminding them that it is not persecution they should fear but the judgment that is coming for all who do not acknowledge the Son of Man. Suddenly a man in the crowd shouts out to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." He seems to have grown tired of Jesus speaking only to the disciples. Jesus offers the man no help. Instead he uses the question to teach what, in light of the coming judgment, life really consist of.

Jesus tells the crowd a parable. A rich man's lands have yielded more crops than expected. His response is not to consider how he might share all the extra food with others but to wonder how he can possibly store it all. He has what he thinks is a brilliant idea: to tear down his present barns and build larger ones. Then he will have many things stored up for years of eating, drinking, and making merry.

"You fool" is God's response to this man because that very night his life will be taken away. To whom will everything belong then, God asks. The rich man's world is small, just him and his possessions, and now he learns that he is to lose his life. What good are his possessions now? Jesus states the moral of the story. This is how it will be for everyone who stores up treasure for himself or herself but is not rich in what matters to God.

Centuries later St. Gregory the Great taught that when we care for the needs of the poor, we are giving them what is theirs, not ours. We are not just performing works of mercy; we are paying a debt of justice. Life does not consist in possessions but in sharing what we possess with others. The goods of the earth have been given to everyone.

During the summer months it is hard to ignore that traffic – both in its volume and in its audacity – have increased dramatically in our area. In response, the Vatican Pontifical Council for Migrants and Itinerant People issued *People on the Move: Guidelines for the Pastoral Care of the Road* (http://www.vatican.va/roman_curia/pontifical_councils/migrants/pom2007_104-suppl/rc_pc_migrants_pom104-suppl_orientamenti-en.html) which, among discussing the benefits and responsibilities of driving, listed ten “commandments” for drivers. When it was released, the press seemed to treat the document with some bemusement and critics immediately blasted the Vatican for failing to concentrate on more important issues facing the Church such as abortion and the overall moral decline of civilization.

I think that to dismiss this document as a humorous “side note” of the Church would be to overlook a very important point that the Vatican was trying to make. Certainly the publication of such a letter recognizes the problem of “road rage” and its attendant issues, but it also tries to make the faithful more aware of the source of such problems, the very same source of the far bigger issues which critics want the Church to address.

The most fundamental principle of moral theology is that human beings are creatures with freedom to make moral choices: that is, we have the ability to discern right from wrong and to choose in accordance with our nature as decreed by God or to choose against that nature. When we choose a moral good (defined objectively and not simply because it “feels good”) we exercise a virtue and when we choose a moral evil we exercise a vice (which in turn leads to a sinful act.) We are presented with hundreds of moral choices a day and a great number of them happen while we are driving a vehicle: what better place to develop and exercise our “moral muscles?”

It seems like years since I’ve heard anyone use the term “defensive driving,” but it’s actually a re-statement of the rule given to us by Jesus: Do unto others as you would have them do unto you. Road rage stems from our feeling a loss of control, but even this results from something more fundamental: the shift from being concerned for others to centering solely on ourselves (which, if you think about it, is also where other moral evils such as abortion and the loss of human dignity come from.) If we can re-learn how to direct our attention from only ourselves and to think of others in such small ways as acts of kindness and respect on the road, who knows where such choices of moral good can lead us?

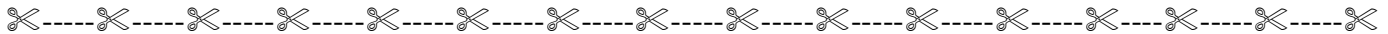

Start each week of your summer of mercy by praying together as a family Pope Francis' Prayer for the Year of Mercy:

Lord Jesus Christ, You have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind. We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy, you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever.
