Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Reflections for The Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time



The second parable that Jesus tells in Luke 18 addresses attitude in prayer. In contrasting the prayer of the Pharisee with the prayer of the tax collector, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray in humility before God. Jesus again surprises his

listeners by showing the tax collector as the example of faith, rather than the Pharisee. Remember that Pharisees were members of a sect of Judaism active in Jesus' time. They taught an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses as the basis for Jewish piety. If anyone would be a model for prayer, a Pharisee was a likely candidate. In contrast, Jesus offers the tax collector as a model for prayer. Tax collectors were collaborators with the Roman authorities in a system that allowed the tax collectors to line their own pockets by charging in excess of the defined taxes. Yet, in this parable, Jesus offers the humility of the tax collector as a model for the prayer of a disciple. The parable reminds us that when we pray, we must remember our need for God in our lives. If we are too full of ourselves, there is too little room for God's grace to work in us.

For those who were unable to attend Mass last weekend, here is the text of my announcement:

The parish agency of the Visitation Relief Center, also known as the VRC, started almost 4 years ago in direct response to Hurricane Sandy relief efforts in the area. During that time, the VRC in cooperation with Catholic Charities helped hundreds of families in rebuilding efforts, provided advice in securing government aid, and offered material and spiritual support to lives devastated by the storm. Visitation parishioners and many local businesses and individuals, seeing the good being done by the Center, generously provided their time, talent and treasure to help. Since mid-2015, when other relief programs began shutting down, the VRC – in addition to its efforts helping those still in need of hurricane relief – began to “re-invent” itself by connecting young people and Christ. It was hoped that through it we could provide a long-term mission of showing our youth and young adults how they could put their faith in action: loving God by loving others through service. Thanks to the efforts of its Director, Christie Winters and her staff, the VRC made great progress towards achieving this goal and becoming a self-sustaining agency and has my heartfelt thanks.

A situation has developed between the VRC and the Office of Construction in the Township of Brick regarding deficiencies in the VRC building, a situation that will cause significant financial damage to Visitation Parish should it continue. After consultation with the parish Finance Council and on the advice of Bishop David O’Connell of Trenton, I must announce that operations at the Visitation Relief Center have ceased as of Friday October 14, 2016. A limited staff will remain for a while to oversee the de-mobilization effort and provide referrals to other services: civil and religious charities as well as the various St. Vincent de Paul Conferences in the area. This is effective until further notice and may be permanent. Also, while donations to the VRC have been suspended, donations to and the work of our own St. Vincent de Paul Society conference are unaffected.

I regret having to make this decision. I believe that, in addition to its aid to the needy, the VRC has been a vital way to bring and keep our young people active in their faith in a way that resonated with them. Of course, we will continue to discern and investigate ways to continue this necessary evangelization. I thank you for your attention. Please pray for those impacted by this development and pray for Visitation parish!

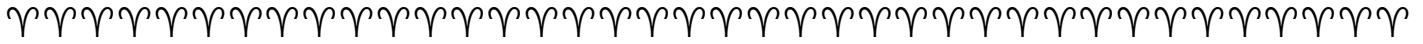

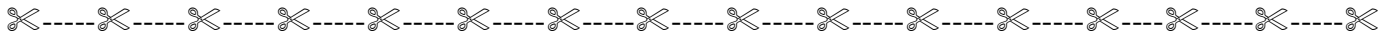


CHILDREN'S CHOIR PRACTICE TIME CHANGE

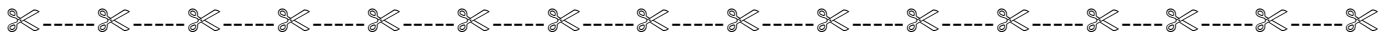

Superhero Creation Lab: In this program your child will create and become their own superhero by using a variety of games and learning activities which emphasize being a hero everyday life through acts of kindness and being a good citizen. Sample activities include the Hero Naming Game, obstacle courses, cape and mask creation, cognitive challenges, rewarded for good deeds they accomplish weekly and their very own superhero ID card! The class will nurture their self-confidence, teamwork skills and their creativity. While having so much fun they will never know they are learning!

Drama Workshops: In the drama workshops the students will be introduced to the tools of an actor and the skills of improvisation, which broadens creative thinking and problem solving. Through game based learning techniques, students will begin to learn and practice theatrical vocabulary along with the rules of performing. They will increase public speaking and effective story telling skills. This includes scene and character creation and development. Every learning element is presented as a game or creative play to institute a fun and exciting learning environment. The class is designed to build self-esteem while having lots of good goofy fun! There will be a small production at the end of the workshop for ALL the students to show off their skills.

All of the programs will support and interlace our Catholic faith. They will gain an understanding of the importance of everyday faith, involvement as a member of the Church and how Jesus and the saints shows us what it takes to be a true hero. They will be reminded how these heroes worked as friends and followers of Jesus to make our world a better place.
