### Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

### Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. ### Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

### Anointing of the Sick

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

*Reflection for  
The Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time*

In today's Gospel, we hear about an n the context of Luke, today's Gospel appears near the end of Jesus' teaching in Jerusalem, just prior to the events that will lead to his crucifixion. His warnings and predictions are ominous but can be read in many ways.

To those who first heard Luke's Gospel, those may have been words of encouragement. The destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem by the Romans was history (70 A.D.); Luke's Gospel, Catholic scholars propose, was written between 80 and 90 A.D. His audience was probably Gentile Christians. Luke here tries to interpret the fall of Jerusalem for them and to locate it in God's plans for humankind (salvation history). At the same time, Luke is suggesting to his audience that there will be a considerable elapse of time before Jesus' final coming. Luke's listeners have likely seen much upheaval and are anxious to know if these are the signs of Jesus' coming. Luke is urging greater patience.

In the second part of today's Gospel, Jesus warns that his followers will face persecution for their beliefs. Luke presents persecution as an opportunity for the followers of Jesus for “It will lead to your giving testimony” (Luke 21:13). In persecution, God's wisdom and power will be shown in the example of followers of Jesus. Perseverance in the face of persecution will lead to their salvation.

Here Jesus is assuring his followers that God is present to all believers, even in times of trouble. Ultimately, Jesus will witness to this with his own death. As disciples of Jesus, we try to follow his example, trusting in God's mercy and protection, even when we are facing difficulties. *Loyola Press*

Many of you have received invitations and – as you can see from the posters at the church entrances – our activity in the Diocese of Trenton’s *Faith to Move Mountains* endowment campaign is about to kick up a notch.

As you may remember from my letter some months back, this program is designed to establish long-range funding resources to support diocesan activities, including parish planning and support. This differs from the Annual Catholic Appeal and parish assessments in that it meets not day-to-day needs, but the strategic direction needed in order for the Church to respond to the extraordinary, fast-paced challenges and needs for faith formation and evangelization that today’s world requires.

In addition, it is Bishop O’Connell’s intention that each parish should benefit from the campaign in order to be better positioned to advance our spiritual mission. Visitation parish will receive 30% of *all* funds collected up to our parish goal of \$775,000 and 70% over that goal. This money will go towards the “Church Covering Project”: replacement of the carpeting in the church and the removal, re-grading and repaving of the parking lot.

The Endowment team has been quite busy preparing for this initiative and you will be hearing more about it through receptions, letters and information sessions prior to the Campaign weekend scheduled for December 10-11. I would invite you to take some time over the coming weeks to avail yourself of this information and to pray on your sacrificial contribution. This initiative is called *Faith to Move Mountains* because that is what we need to do if the faith handed on to us is to endure and grow. Now, more than ever, the mountains loom large. Only your faith and generosity will move them as, together, we continue to believe that “nothing is impossible” with God.

### **USE CANDLES WITH CARE, WHEN YOU GO OUT, BLOW OUT!**

As part of fire prevention month, follow these simple guidelines to assist in keeping our community and residents safe.

- 1) Use sturdy, non-flammable candleholders that won't tip over easily.
- 2) If you must burn candles- use level uncluttered surfaces.
- 3) Keep candles at least one foot away from anything that can burn.
- 4) Keep candles away from spots where they could be knocked over by someone.
- 5) Trim candlewicks to a quarter inch before lighting.
- 6) Don't place lit candles in windows or near doorways where drafts could cause combustibles to make contact and ignite.
- 7) Keep candles and open flames away from flammable liquids.
- 8) Extinguish candles when they burn to within 2 inches of their holder. Be careful not to splatter the hot wax.
- 9) Votives and filled candles should be extinguished before the last 1/2 inch of wax starts to melt.

### **10) Never leave burning candles unattended.**
