Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. *Reflections for
The Second Sunday of Advent*



In this week's Gospel Reading and next week's, our Advent preparation for Christmas invites us to consider John the Baptist and his relationship to Jesus. In this week's Gospel, Matthew describes the work and preaching of John the Baptist.

John the Baptist appears in the tradition of the great prophets of Israel, preaching repentance and reform to the people of Israel. In this reading, John directs a particularly pointed call to repentance to the Pharisees and Sadducees, parties within the Jewish community of the first century.

John marks the conversion of those who seek him out with a baptism of repentance. Other groups in this period are thought to have practiced ritual washings for similar purposes, and John's baptism may have been related to the practices of the Essenes, a Jewish sect of the first century. John's baptism can be understood as an anticipation of Christian baptism. In this passage, John himself alludes to the difference between his baptism and the one yet to come: "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance . . . He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." (Matthew 3:11).

In this reading, John makes very clear that his relationship to the Messiah yet to come (Jesus) is one of service and subservience: ". . . the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals" (Matthew 3:11). In the context of Matthew's Gospel, today's passage is followed by Jesus' baptism by John, an event that is attested to in all four of the Gospels and appears to have been the start of Jesus' public ministry.

John's preaching of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. As John's message prepared the way for Jesus in the first century, we, too, are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We respond to John's message by our repentance and reform of our lives. We are also called to be prophets of Christ, who announce by our lives, as John did, the coming of the Lord.

SOCIETIES

On November 19th, Poland's bishops, people and president formally declared Jesus Christ to be King of Poland. Cardinal Dziwisz was the principal celebrant at the Divine Mercy shrine in Krakow. This declaration corresponded to the end of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy and the 1,050th anniversary of Polish Christianity. Fifty years ago, Cardinal Dziwisz's predecessor and former boss, Archbishop Wojtyła, led Poland in the 1,000th anniversary while under the harsh rule of Soviet Communism. Twelve years later, Cardinal Wojtyła was elected pontiff and chose the name, John Paul II. When he visited Poland in 1979, he enflamed the Solidarity movement which led to the fairly peaceful downfall of communism in Eastern Europe.

On November 25th, Black Friday, the most capitalistic day of the year, Fidel Castro died. Did he repent of the great evil he did in the sight of the Lord? May God have mercy on his soul and all he harmed. Could the timing be God's way of communicating to the world that both communism and extreme capitalism are wrong? We must be mindful of people in our economies. God loves Cuba which used to be a thriving, religious country until the Castro family seized power. Could Cuba gain her freedom as Poland did in 1989?

In light of recent events in our own country, it is becoming clearer that we too need to recognize Jesus Christ as our King lest we go down the destructive path of Cuba. How can we follow where Poland is now, where families, the government, and the Church agree that Jesus Christ is our King?

Let's start by recognizing that we all belong to a variety of societies, including sports teams, schools, jobs, the Rosary Altar Society, the Holy Name Society, and the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Each society has its own purpose, structure, rules, and customs.

The three most fundamental societies are family, the state, and the Church. A family has a father, mother, and children and is connected to their extended family. The state works for the common good of civil society. The Church consists of followers of Christ who proclaim the Good News to the world. Each of these societies has its own proper role and ought to help the other societies. The Church is not competent to tell the state how to structure itself. Yet, the Church can declare that communism and extreme capitalism are wrong. The Church can also tell families God's divine plan for human love, but it is up to the father and mother to decide how to educate their children. The Church and the state ought to help families. And families are the basic building blocks of the state and the Church.

Our own country has chosen to be a democratic republic. It relies on churches to teach citizens how to be virtuous. When the state acts in opposition to churches, families suffer. For our country to emerge from its current difficulties, we need the Church to proclaim the Good News and sacrifice for the common good. We need families to embrace Christ as King. With a stronger Church in America and healthier and holier families, we will help the state to remember itself and once again fulfill its responsibility for promoting the common good.

Poland's example can give us hope. During Advent, may God increase supernatural hope in us so that we may more eagerly run to meet Christ, our King.

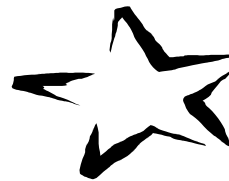
