(Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

### Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

## CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PAGEANT



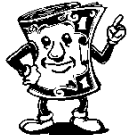

## *Reflections for The Third Sunday of Advent*



This week's Gospel Reading continues our Advent reflection on the person and message of John the Baptist. Last week we heard John speak about his relationship to the coming Messiah, Jesus. This week, we hear Jesus' message to John the Baptist, now in prison, about the signs of the kingdom found in Jesus' ministry and Jesus' assessment of John's role in the Kingdom of God.

The Gospel of Matthew tells the story of John's arrest in chapter 14:3-12. In today's Gospel, John sends word to Jesus from prison, asking if Jesus is the Messiah for whom he has been waiting. Jesus responds by pointing to the miracles that he has worked and invites John and the other hearers to make their own determination. In his next breath, however, Jesus praises John for his role in preparing the way for Jesus. Then Jesus says that all of those who work for the Kingdom of God will be as great as John and even greater.

Jesus' message to John about the signs of the kingdom being performed recalls the salvation described by the prophet Isaiah. This passage is a reminder that the beginning of salvation is already mysteriously present to us, but also yet to be fulfilled. Salvation is already in our midst as manifest in the miraculous deeds of Jesus and in the Church. But salvation is also to be fulfilled in the coming reign of God. Even as we observe our world today, we can find glimpses of God's work among us. Even more, we help to prepare the way for God's kingdom by our words and our deeds. This message is indeed a cause for rejoicing. *Loyola Press*

*From the Pastor's Desk*



To all of the good people of Visitation,

**FAITH TO MOVE MOUNTAINS:** This weekend, we are asking every family to join us in participating in the Diocese's *Faith to Move Mountains* campaign. I am asking each of you to consider pledging a small amount each month over a three-to-five-year period. Pledging allows us the opportunity to make a sacrificial gift that will help to shape the Church we leave for future generations of Catholic families in our community. These suggested giving plans are an example of how a pledge can have a profound impact on our parish and provide the Diocese with the endowments needed to permanently strengthen our parishes and schools; support our seminarians, retired priests, and deacons; grow our educational offerings; and enhance our social services:

**TEN STEPS TO RECONCILIATION**

- 1. Admit and express your feelings.** Write them in a journal; talk them out with an impartial friend. Be honest. Say what you want to say. Get it all out.
- 2. Decide & pray.** Forgiveness is not a matter of feeling, but of decision. The decision to forgive will not automatically change your feelings, but it's a start. Pray for the desire to forgive. Pray that the Lord will change both hearts. Forgiveness is a process; it takes time. Be generous with your time and your heart.
- 3. Confess and repent.** Focus on your sins, not the other persons'. What did I do to contribute to the situation? No one is ever totally innocent. "It takes two..." Rid yourself of resentment; it does no good.
- 4. Let go of fear and anger.** Out of fear, our hearts can harden to protect us from further hurt. We delay reconciliation because of fear of rejection. The longer one waits to reconcile, the more anger and resentment grows. What are you waiting for? Start the process. (Read and reflect on Psalm 51).
- 5. Gain a fair perspective.** When hurt, our imagination has "a field day." Exaggeration blossoms. Get grounded. Place yourself in the other person's shoes. Try to understand.
- 6. Imagine the meeting.** Use your imagination in a positive way. Reflect on what you will say and do. Practice smiling. Imagine that Jesus is in the room with both of you. What is He asking of you?
- 7. Meet with the other person.** Reach out. Take a risk. What have you got to lose? Choose a time when neither will feel rushed. Have a positive attitude. Begin the meeting with prayer. Each speak about the experience from your own perspective. Be open to another interpretation. There are always three perspectives: yours, the other person's, and the truth.
- 8. Give thanks to God.** If successful, offer thanks to God. If not, give thanks for the opportunity to put Gospel teachings into practice. Remember, we learn from our failures as well as our successes. Most of the time, there will be a tomorrow.
- 9. Deepen the reconciliation.** The process continues. This initial act of forgiveness will need to be ratified by other acts of kindness. Make plans for the next get-together: dinner, shopping; some activity that will allow for communication.
- 10. Be patient.** Few friendships are established in one setting; they develop over time. Reconciliation takes time, too. Be good to yourself and your friend. Let reconciliation grow and develop. You're both worth it.
