Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Reflections for

The Fourth Sunday of Advent



The Gospel of Matthew tells the story of the birth of Jesus from Joseph's perspective. Today's Gospel passage is the second movement in this story. In the preceding verses of the first chapter of Matthew's Gospel, the Evangelist has listed the genealogy of Jesus, tracing his lineage through King David to Abraham. In the chapter to follow, Matthew tells of the visit from the Magi, the Holy Family's flight into Egypt, and Herod's massacre of the infants in Bethlehem. (The other stories which we associate with Christmas, the Annunciation, the Visitation, the angel and the shepherds, are found in the Gospel of Luke).

We must not gloss over too quickly the difficult circumstances described in today's Gospel. The way that Joseph and Mary face these circumstances tells us much about these holy people and their faith in God. Joseph and Mary are betrothed to be married. This is sometimes described as an engagement period, but it is more than that. Betrothal in first century Jewish culture was in fact the first part of the marriage contract. A breach of this contract was considered adultery. Mary is found to be with child. If adultery is proven, the punishment might be death. Joseph has rights under Mosaic law, but chooses to act discreetly in his plans to break the marriage contract, so as to protect Mary. Then God intervenes.

The message of the angel of the Lord given to Joseph in his dream tells us much about the child that Mary bears and his role in God's plan. He is conceived by the Holy Spirit. His name will be Jesus, which in the Hebrew means “Yahweh saves.” He will be the fulfillment of the prophecy heard in today's first reading from Isaiah: “. . . The virgin shall be with child . . . and shall name him Emmanuel [God with us].”

Joseph does as the angel of the Lord directs. He takes Mary to be his wife and accepts the child in her womb as his own. Joseph and Mary are both cooperative with God's plan. They are both models for us of what it means to be faithful servants of God. *Loyola Press*

After a weekend Mass not too long ago, one of the ushers handed me a small slip of paper. It appears that, instead of taking a tag for the Giving Tree, someone put one in an unsigned letter not to Santa Claus but to God. Amidst drawn pictures of hearts, a chalice and a crucifix, it simply said: “*Dear God, I have been well behaved and good. We love you.*” As I looked upon this example of innocence which only young children and the angels possess, I couldn't help but wonder where and how we lose it. How do we become so adept at looking for hidden meanings the happenings of our lives, both the bad and the good? How do we develop the skill of anguishing about events over which we really have very little control and expend so much energy on a future that is not in our hands but in God's? Is there any way we can try to re-capture, at least in part, some of that trust which children so instinctively give to those in charge of their lives?

Certainly at this time of year, which is correctly called *the Season of Advent* but instead has become better known as *the Holiday Shopping Season*, we are given many opportunities to find the answers to some of these questions. Maybe we can reconcile ourselves to the fact that we *won't* find (or afford) the perfect present, but instead we can find (or make or do for someone as) a present which truly comes from the heart. Maybe a Christmas feast suitable for the cover of *Better Homes and Gardens* isn't what we're called to prepare, but instead a simpler one which welcomes those who participate as friends and family into a home in which God also has a place. Instead of looking upon the “Christmas and Easter Catholics” that will soon crowd our churches as an intrusion, we can offer a friendly hand or word of welcome that may encourage them to visit more frequently.

As we complete our preparations to welcome the Christ-child in our midst, let's practice a little of that child-like trust and innocence and give our Heavenly Father the chance to do the rest, to remind ourselves and demonstrate to others that we love Him, too!

In today's bulletin you will find the financial report of Visitation parish for the last fiscal year. As you can see, we continue to draw into our parish savings reserve (the amount which the parish is required to maintain in order to respond to emergencies; you could call it the parish “rainy day” fund, but as any rainy day, its use is not designed to last forever.) I hope that the enclosed report will provide some insight into this hard reality and trust that we all pray and work with our Lord to keep our parish in a position to provide for the spiritual and material needs of our community for years to come.

THE KING IS COMING!

The King is coming! The King is coming! This is a cry we heard during the season of Advent. Yes, the King did come, not as a person of worldly power and might, but as a helpless child. Isn't it interesting that Christ's coming was the result of a choice? Mary, His Mother, was given a choice. Will she or will she not agree to accept Jesus as her child and bring him into the world? We too are given a similar choice. Each of us has to decide to accept or reject Jesus as our Lord and Savior, not only at Christmas, but each moment of our lives. Choosing Jesus is an ongoing decision, not one just for the Christmas season. We are continually faced with choices on how we wish to live our lives. Do we live them as followers of the teachings and examples of Jesus Christ, or as followers of the allurements of the world? These choices are not always easy. Temptations are not meant to be. But, they are there for us to demonstrate our love for God.

What does it mean to choose Jesus Christ? It simply means we are to live as Jesus did--we are to love others as He loved us. And, according to Christ, even to those who don't like us. That's real hard to do, but we have to do it and we can by asking for help to love those people that we know are hard to love. We are to forgive everyone, just as God forgave each of us through the sacrifice of His Son. Jesus was born through Mary and she shared Him with the world. Jesus is also to be born in us and we are to share Him with the world. One way we can do this is to share the message of hope through Jesus Christ. That should have been our Christmas message. As the angels that first night proclaimed and gave glory to Christ—we are to go forth and do the same--bringing the message of hope to those that we know are hurting. Tell them to bring Jesus into their lives. It doesn't mean their troubles will go away--that their cancer will disappear or their jobs will be restored, although that can happen--but through Christ they will receive an enduring grace of comfort, a peace not possible from any other source.

Jesus gave us not only examples and teachings that we can follow but He also gave us the graces that we need to choose the Jesus life-style. Every time we receive the Eucharist we are celebrating Christmas—the coming of the Christ Child into our hearts and souls. St. Francis and the Saints of our Church were well aware of this. That is why they dedicated their lives to choosing Jesus Christ. They really believed what Jesus said: "Announce the kingdom! Possess no gold or silver or copper in your purses, no traveling bag, no sandals, no staff" (see Luke 9:1-3). Each, according to their capabilities, accepted this message almost as if it was there mantra. Their primary motivation was to become one with Jesus and to be as Jesus in their relationship with others. Rather than expecting to receive, as so many do during the Christmas season, their goal was to give of themselves to others as they felt Jesus would do.

Four weeks of Advent were scarcely enough to "prepare the way of the Lord". Christ's coming must be considered as a reality, which can be accomplished in how we live our lives, not a commercial experience or a pastoral scene. As we move beyond the Christmas season, let us ask ourselves how we can be a present to others through our presence in their lives every day of the year.
