Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Anointing of the Sick

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for an extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

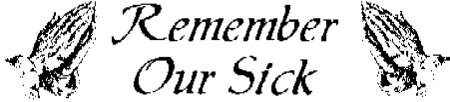

Reflections for The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Following upon the teaching of the Beatitudes, Jesus uses the now familiar metaphors of salt and light to describe the life of discipleship. We take salt and light for granted in our society, but these commodities were more precious in ancient cultures. Just as now, salt was used in Jesus' time for flavoring, as a preservative, and as a healing agent. Similarly, the widespread use of electricity in the modern world makes us less aware of the value and importance of light in our lives.

Still, our familiarity with this passage from Matthew's Gospel speaks well to the abiding power of the imagery that Jesus presented. Jesus' call to be salt for the earth and light for the world powerfully states our mission as Church and as Christians. Our commitment to social justice flows from the exhortation that Jesus gives us in today's Gospel. Some of the activities that this commitment leads us to are given more concrete expression as the Corporal and Spiritual [Works of Mercy](#). When we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, console those who mourn, and so on, we show ourselves to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. When we do these things with the community of faith, the Church, we are indeed acting as “a city set on a mountain” that cannot be hidden!

MARCH FOR LIFE

Unlike other years I was alone for much of the 2017 March for Life in Washington. This gave me a chance to explore the crowd and pay attention. We were peaceful and joyful, even jubilant. It wasn't so much a protest against abortion as a celebration of the gift of life that God has given us. We were patient, diverse, and encouraged.

Just like other years, I stumbled upon a number of people that I know. This year, I met up with the diocesan staff at the rendezvous point. No one else joined us because they all wanted to see the speakers including Vice President Mike Pence. I saw Fr. Allain Caparas from the Diocese of Camden and three priests from the Diocese of Arlington. We were in seminary together. I bumped into Fr. Brian Woodrow from Allentown who directed me to Bishop O'Connell. He was with Fr. Alberto Tamayo who was ordained a few seconds after me. I spoke with Fr. Al and Brother Nick about the Oratory in Red Bank. Near the end of the March, I saw Fr. Ed Jawidzik and talked with him about Respect Life in the Diocese of Trenton. He's the chaplain for Monmouth County while I'm the chaplain for Ocean County.

I think I saw Christopher & Joan Bell from Good Counsel Homes. They were marching just like the rest of us. I was impressed by their humility. We have a Good Counsel Home in Riverside where homeless, pregnant women can live, learn, and grow.

To my pleasant surprise, a beautiful family connected to my previous parish found me. Jess recognized me right away, but I wasn't sure which identical twin she was. Her husband, Gabriel Miravalle, found a new job at Mount St. Mary's. He enjoys teaching seminarians. You may have heard of his father, Mark Miravalle, who is known for his work in Mariology.

Speaking of Mary, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes is coming up on Saturday. Back on 11 February 1858, our Blessed Mother appeared to St. Bernadette for the first of eighteen times. On her March 25th visit, she identified herself as the Immaculate Conception. That's doubly significant for the pro-life movement. First, Mary was immaculately conceived in the womb of her mother St. Ann. Second, Mary revealed this name on the feast of the Annunciation when she conceived Jesus in her own womb by the power of the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the conceptions of Jesus and Mary. We ought to respect the lives of all human beings from the moment of their conception until their natural death. In between, we can also appeal to Our Lady of Lourdes for healing of the sick.

On the way home from the March for Life, I enjoyed a number of deep, philosophical, and theological conversations about life issues, the Church, and evangelization. Fellow Catholics from around here recognize the challenges we face and are enthusiastic about proclaiming the truth in love.
