Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

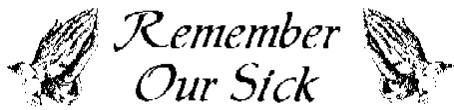

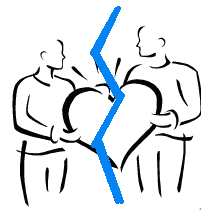

Reflections for The Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time



The last two antitheses offered in the Sermon on the Mount deal with love of enemies. We should not look at “an eye for an eye” as an inordinately strict punishment. It is actually meant to limit acts of revenge by making sure the punishment is not excessive but fits the crime. However, Jesus asks his followers to take a different approach by resisting retaliation altogether. The response to a stronger person who slaps us on the cheek, takes us to court, or demands a service of us is not to resist. Similarly, for a weaker person, such as a beggar or borrower, we are to give him or her what he or she asks for. Those who are called to the Kingdom of Heaven are to go beyond the way the world usually works and serve God’s kingdom here on earth.

The other difficult demand of those who are called to the kingdom is to embrace the enemy. There is no command in the Old Testament to hate individuals in a personal or vindictive way. But there is a religious stance that calls one to hate evil and to distance oneself from those who participate in evil. In contrast, Matthew emphasizes that love of God and love of neighbor are the fundamental commands on which all else depend. Because God’s love is unconditional, we are to strive to love as God does, though, of course, it is challenging. Is it even possible?

The key is in the final verse. We are to be perfect as our heavenly father is perfect. Matthew uses the Greek word telos, which is probably better translated here as “complete.” We are not to be perfect as in doing everything correctly, that is, as in being absolutely morally correct. We are to be perfect as in striving to reach the completeness we are called to in the Kingdom of Heaven. Attempting to love our enemies is part of striving for that completeness.

This Monday is Presidents Day. Far more than a day for retail sales blitzes, for those enough old to remember, the date was originally meant to honor our *first* President, George Washington, on his birthday. Around the same time that the Monday Holidays Act went into effect in 1968, Washington's birthday changed to commemorate all the presidents and moved from February 22 to the third Monday in February, where it has been since.

This year's observance is particular noteworthy because of the current divisive views of our government, and particularly the presidency, of the United States. Whether we agree with policies or not, whether we like the person currently in the office or not, we are always expected to regard the office with proper respect. From the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* we find "Human society can be neither well-ordered nor prosperous unless it has some people invested with legitimate authority to preserve its institutions and to devote themselves as far as is necessary to work and care for the good of all. Every human community needs an authority to govern it. The foundation of such authority lies in human nature. It is necessary for the unity of the state. Its role is to ensure as far as possible the common good of the society. The authority required by the moral order derives from God...The duty of obedience requires all to give due honor to authority and to treat those who are charged to exercise it with respect, and, insofar as it is deserved, with gratitude and good-will" (CCC 1897-1900).

On this Presidents Day we are called to pray for our President and other leaders, to seek God's guidance in the leadership of our country and to both pray and work that our government leaders may always "legitimately seek the common good and discern the morally licit means to attain it." (c.f. CCC 1903).

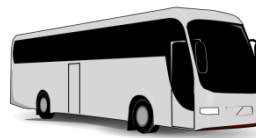

RITE OF ELECTION



Across the entire world, Catholic Bishops on the first Sunday of Lent will welcome those sent by their parishes to gather together, with their godparents, in what is known as the **Rite of Election**. The Rite of Sending, which we will celebrate on February 25, offers the parish community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress the Catechumens have made. We express approval of their Election or recognition, and send them forth to our Bishop with assurance of the parish's care and support. To send a catechumen or candidate to the Bishop means that a parish has discerned that the person is ready to be Baptized and enter the Catholic Church. In Sacred Scripture, the Book of Revelation makes reference to the "Book of Life," in which are written the names of those who have chosen to follow the Lord Jesus and be Baptized. Those already baptized as Catholics, or in other denominations, had our names written in the Book of Life at our Baptism. In this Rite, those preparing for Baptism are invited to come forward and sign the book, which we call the "Book of the Elect," as a sign of their desire to be numbered among the chosen, or the Elect of God.
