Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

(Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. 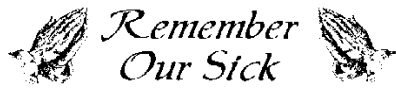

Reflections for The Fifth Sunday of Lent

Today's Gospel reading recounts another sign, or miracle, found in John's Gospel, the raising of Lazarus. The context for the story of the raising of Lazarus is the Jewish leaders' growing animosity toward Jesus. Jesus has been in Jerusalem, taking part in the feast of the Dedication, which we have come to know as Hanukkah. The people have been pressing him to declare plainly whether he is the Messiah. Jesus tells them to look to his works, which testify to his coming from God. Many do not believe Jesus, however, and some try to stone him for blasphemy.

Into this scene of confrontation, Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus, send word to Jesus that his friend is ill. Jesus is said to love Mary, Martha, and Lazarus, but he delays his journey for two days. The delay heightens the drama and shows Jesus' obedience to God, who is to be glorified through Lazarus's resurrection. When Jesus finally declares that he will journey to Bethany, his disciples fear for his life. Thomas declares that he and the other disciples should prepare to die with Jesus.

The scene described at Bethany is a sad one. Martha meets Jesus weeping and saying that if Jesus had been there, Lazarus would not have died. Yet she remains confident that God will do whatever Jesus asks. Martha affirms her belief that there will be a resurrection of the dead in the last days. Then Martha's sister, Mary, comes to Jesus with the same confidence, saying that Jesus could have cured Lazarus. Jesus asks to be brought to Lazarus's tomb where he prays and calls Lazarus out from the tomb. At this sign, many come to believe in Jesus, but others take word of the miracle to the Jewish authorities, who begin their plans for Jesus' death.

Set against the backdrop of Jesus' impending death, many elements of the raising of Lazarus foreshadow the good news of Jesus' own Resurrection. Jesus, facing the conflict with the Jewish authorities, acts in complete obedience to God. In raising Lazarus, Jesus shows his power over death so that when Jesus dies, those who believe in him might remember that and take hope. Just as Jesus calls for the stone to be rolled away from Lazarus's tomb, so too will the disciples find the stone rolled away from Jesus' tomb.

In Baptism we die to sin's power over us, rising as children of God. In Baptism we join ourselves with Christ, who conquered death once and for all so that we who believe in him may have eternal life. With Martha and Mary, we are called to profess our belief that Jesus is indeed the Resurrection and the life.

FROM THE DESK OF

OCEAN OF MERCY

Before I became a priest, I watched *Ocean of Mercy*. It is available to our parish via Formed.org. Look in the “Video” section under “Documentaries.” Fr. Ed will explain how to access Formed within a few weeks. *Ocean of Mercy* portrays the stories of St. Faustina Kowalska, St. Maximilian Kolbe, and Pope St. John Paul II. They are modern day “Apostles of Mercy.” I offer this recommendation for three reasons.

First, Pope St. John Paul II was called home to the Father’s house twelve years ago on 2 April 2005. When the world experiences great evil, God raises up great saints. It is fitting that He has chosen to convey His mercy to the world via three Polish saints. From Poland, the heart of Europe, we see God revealing His merciful heart.

Second, we are fast approaching the Easter Triduum. This is a wonderful time to receive God’s mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We will have two Lenten penance services this Tuesday, April 4th, at 2 p.m. and 7 p.m. Fr. Ed and I are also hearing confessions at the normal time on Saturdays at 3 p.m. We’ll skip Holy Saturday in order to give all of us a better chance to wait quietly for Easter. Fr. Ed and I are also available to hear confessions at other times. Just give us a call. Most of us feel shame and sorrow approaching confession. Yet, when we hear the words of absolution, we know we’re forgiven. We can leave confession jubilant, filled with God’s merciful love.

Third, if we are worried about the future, being reminded of God’s mercy can help. I especially recommend learning more about Pope St. John Paul II and what he taught by word and example. He was a key figure in peacefully bringing down Communism in Eastern Europe. His efforts began even before he became a priest when he was involved in a clandestine theater group. He worked for and promoted a transformation of culture. The word “culture” is related to “cult.” How we worship God impacts how we live in our culture. If you think that our society is in terrible trouble, that we need God, then we need to worship Him more faithfully. Next, He will work through us for a transformation of our culture. Applying bandages to our hemorrhaging society won’t work. We need a thorough transformation in how we love God and love neighbor. We were surprised that it happened in Eastern Europe. We can pray to be pleasantly surprised for such a transformation in these United States. God is merciful. He invites us to receive His mercy and be merciful to our neighbor.

Ten Steps to Reconciliation

1 Admit and express your feelings. Write them in a journal; talk them out with an impartial friend. Be honest. Say what you want to say. Get it all out.

2 Decide & pray. Forgiveness is not a matter of *feeling*, but of *decision*. The decision to forgive will not automatically change your feelings, but it's a start. Pray for the *desire* to forgive. Pray that the Lord will change *both* hearts. Forgiveness is a process; it takes time. Be generous with your time and your heart.

3 Confess and repent. Focus on *your* sins, not the other persons'. What did I do to contribute to the situation? No one is ever totally innocent. "*It takes two...*" Rid yourself of resentment; it does no good.

4. Let go of fear and anger. Out of fear, our hearts can harden to protect us from further hurt. We delay reconciliation because of fear of rejection. The longer one waits to reconcile, the more anger and resentment grows. *What are you waiting for?* Start the process. (Read and reflect on Psalm 51).

5 Gain a fair perspective. When hurt, our imagination has "a field day." Exaggeration blossoms. Get grounded. Place yourself in the other person's shoes. Try to understand.

6 Imagine the meeting. Use your imagination in a positive way. Reflect on what you will say and do. Practice smiling. Imagine that Jesus is in the room with both of you. *What is He asking of you?*

7 Meet with the other person. Reach out. Take a risk. What have you got to lose? Choose a time when neither will feel rushed. Have a positive attitude. Begin the meeting with prayer. Each speak about the experience from your own perspective. Be open to another interpretation. There are always three perspectives: yours, the other person's, and the truth.

8 Give thanks to God. If successful, offer thanks to God. If not, give thanks for the opportunity to put Gospel teachings into practice. Remember, we learn from our failures as well as our successes. Most of the time, there will be a tomorrow.

9 Deepen the reconciliation. The process continues. This initial act of forgiveness will need to be ratified by other acts of kindness. Make plans for the next get-together: dinner, shopping; some activity that will allow for communication.

10 Be patient. Few friendships are established in one setting; they develop over time. Reconciliation takes time, too. Be good to yourself and your friend. Let reconciliation grow and develop. You're both worth it.
