Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for an extended period. In an emergency call the Parish office anytime.

Reflections for

The Transfiguration of the Lord

Today's liturgy invites us to celebrate the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. This feast calls to our attention the importance of this event in Jesus' life, further affirmed by its report in each of the Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In Cycle A, the reading for this feast is taken from the Gospel of Matthew. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter confesses his belief that Jesus is the Messiah and after Jesus predicts his Passion.

In each Gospel, Jesus takes three of his disciples—Peter, James, and John—to a high mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear and converse with Jesus. Elijah and Moses are both significant figures in the history of Israel. Moses led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and received from Yahweh the Ten Commandments. Moses represents the Law, which guides the lives of the Jewish people. Elijah is one of the most important prophets of Israel who helped the Israelites stay faithful to Yahweh, and some believed that Elijah's return would signal the coming of the Messiah for the Jewish people. The appearance of these two figures from Israel's history indicated Jesus' continuity with the Law and the prophets. They also reveal that Jesus is the fulfillment of all that was promised to the people of Israel.

Upon witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, an awestruck Peter offered to construct three tents for them when a voice from Heaven affirms that Jesus is "my beloved Son" and commands the disciples to listen to him.

In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructed the disciples to keep secret what they had seen until after "the Son of Man has been raised from the dead." Until they witnessed Jesus' Passion and Death, the disciples could not possibly understand what he meant by being "raised from the dead." We, however, have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of the Transfiguration Gospel, we see an anticipation of Jesus' Resurrection, a foreshadowing of Christ's glory in Heaven, and the promise of our own resurrection.

FROM THE DESK OF

ART AND BEAUTY

The Pope's August intention is for artists, "That artists of our time, through their ingenuity, may help everyone discover the beauty of creation." God is always reaching out to us. He succeeds with many of us initially through the beauty of His creation. We may enjoy a walk along the boardwalk, peering to the horizon, trying to see our ancestral homeland. We may marvel at the docility and number of bunny rabbits outside the front door. A group of deer may make our back yard their own place of rest. If artists portraying the beauty of creation can help us see more clearly God revealing Himself to us, then we will come to know Him better, love Him more, and serve Him more faithfully in this life as we look forward to being with Him in the next.

Knowing anything real seems challenging to many in modern times. People doubt that we can reach the essence of a thing via our senses. This philosophical challenge is studied in phenomenology. Among those who worked to bridge the gap between our perceptions and reality is St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (aka Edith Stein). Her feast day is on Wednesday, the 9th, since she was martyred at Auschwitz on August 9, 1942. Among her books is *The Science of the Cross*. Perhaps one of the most real things is Jesus dying on the cross for us.

We celebrate St. Lawrence, deacon and martyr, on Thursday the 10th. He is the unofficial patron saint for barbecues and peculiar humor. When the Roman authorities demanded the treasure of the Church, he showed them the poor. Not amused, they burned him alive on a gridiron. After a little while, he stated that he was done on this side and could be turned over.

Today, we celebrate the Transfiguration of the Lord. Peter, James, and John received a glimpse of the Lord's glory as He stood between Moses and Elijah. Besides hearing the Gospel, we can view an artist's rendition of the blessed event. We might philosophize about the meaning of the event and how the reality was communicated to the three apostles. We can marvel at the grace being offered to them as it was to Edith Stein and St. Lawrence. While admiring the beauty of God's creation, we might peer more deeply into reality and perceive how much God loves us, delights in us, and desires us to be fully healed and glorified by Him.

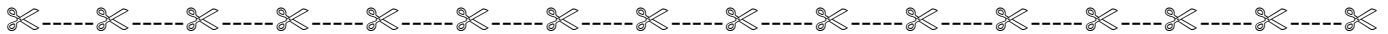
