Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Reflections for

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we move ahead in our reading of Matthew’s Gospel. Last week we read about Jesus walking on the water and the disciples’ confession of faith that Jesus is the Son of God. If we were reading Matthew’s entire Gospel, we would have read about Jesus’ debate with the Pharisees about Jewish purity laws. Jesus argues that it is not what goes into us that makes us unclean; he is referring to the strict Jewish dietary rules. Instead our words and our actions—what comes out of us—make us unclean because they emerge from a heart that is unclean.

Knowing about Jesus’ debate with the Pharisees helps us to understand today’s Gospel. In fact the story heightens the surprise and shock we feel as we hear Jesus’ exchange with the Canaanite woman. The woman, who is not Jewish, approaches Jesus, requesting that he heal her demon-possessed daughter. At first Jesus ignores her; he says nothing. The disciples ask Jesus to send her away, and Jesus agrees, remarking that he was sent to minister to the Jews alone.

The woman persists, paying homage to Jesus, and yet Jesus denies her request again. He even insults her, using a Jewish word of derision for Gentiles, “dog.” But the woman cleverly turns Jesus’ insult into an affirmation of faith. Only then does Jesus grant her request and heal her daughter.

Jesus’ unresponsiveness to this woman may strike us as uncharacteristic or shocking. Yet in Matthew’s Gospel, Jesus’ ministry is directed primarily to the people of Israel. At only a very few points, such as the one found in today’s Gospel, do we find Jesus anticipating the later Christian ministry to the rest of the world.

Behind Matthew’s text we can hear this early Christian community’s struggle to understand how God’s selection of Israel is consistent with two events: Israel’s rejection of Jesus and the Gentiles’ acceptance of Jesus. Just as Jesus was surprised by the faith expressed by the Canaanite woman, so too the first Christians were surprised that the Gentiles would receive the salvation God offered through Christ. In today’s second reading from Paul’s letter to the Romans, we hear the apostle Paul considering this same concern.

The faith that the Canaanite woman expresses is an affirmation of and confidence in God’s abundant mercy. Yes, salvation comes through Israel, but it overflows for the benefit of all.

“A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun.” (Rv. 12:1) Many Christians whose faith is based on *sola scriptura* (“Scripture alone!”) are quick to criticize the Catholic belief in the Assumption of Mary into Heaven. To be sure, there is no direct mention of it in the Bible. But it is the logical conclusion to her life; *the Assumption* of Mary is *an assumption*, to be sure, but it is a perfectly valid one. From the moment Mary said, “Let it be” when the Holy Spirit overshadowed her and she conceived the Savior of the world, she revealed herself to be chosen by God.

As Mary was the first told of the coming of God’s Son among us, she is also the first to benefit fully – body and soul – from the power of Jesus’ Resurrection. In the words of the Opening Prayer of the Mass for August 15th, the Solemnity of the Assumption, we heard: “looking on the lowliness of the Blessed Virgin Mary, you raised her to this grace, that your only begotten Son was born of her according to the flesh and that she was crowned this day with surpassing glory.” Here, Mary’s role as both mother and sharer in the full fruits of her Son's Resurrection are brought together.

There is an image in the book of Revelation that is often applied to Mary. It depicts a woman clothed with the sun, standing on the moon, and wearing a crown of 12 stars. This powerful image of a woman reigning over the universe has become an icon of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth. Artists painting or sculpting Mary often show her dressed as the woman in Revelation, reminding us of the Catholic belief that these scriptures are telling us of Mary’s place in Heaven.

Our celebration of this event last Tuesday is meant to give all Christians hope. Throughout our lives, we strive to keep Mary as our model, ever ready to accept whatever may happen as long as it is God’s will. If we pattern our life joyfully on hers, her life in glory will become the pattern for ours.

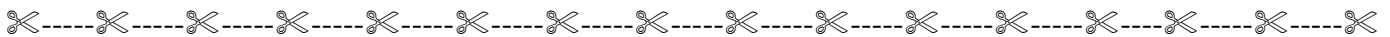
